**PUBLIC NOTICE**

**The City of Seattle Is Seeking Volunteers for the Nathan Hale High School Departure Advisory Committee!**

Here's your chance to serve on an advisory committee that will recommend whether to grant a waiver or not for a proposed electronic reader board at Nathan Hale High School located at 10750 30<sup>th</sup> Avenue NE.

The Seattle School District is requesting a waiver (departure) to install an approximately 24 square foot double sided illuminated electronic reader board sign located on a concrete post about 15 feet above the sidewalk located along NE 110<sup>th</sup> Street approximately mid-block between 30<sup>th</sup> and 35<sup>th</sup> Avenues NE and across the street from the Jane Addams Sports Field. The purpose of the sign is to notify the school and neighboring community about school events and community items of interest.

The process for considering this request involves public meetings before a committee composed of neighborhood, School District, and City of Seattle representatives. **The Department of Neighborhoods is therefore seeking interested persons to serve on this committee for Nathan Hale High School.** The Committee will gather and evaluate public comment on the departure request for the sign. The Committee can grant a departure and state any relevant conditions to be applied to minimize its impacts on the surrounding neighborhood, or recommend denial of the departures.

The Committee will be composed of eight (8) representatives from the following groups to the extent that members are available:

1. A person residing within 600 feet of the proposed site.
2. A person owning property or a business within 600 feet of the proposed site.
3. Two (2) representatives of the general neighborhood.
4. A representative-at-large.
5. Two (2) representatives of the PTSA.
6. A representative of the Seattle School District.
