INCIDENT SYNOPSIS

The Named Employee was working in the traffic unit.

COMPLAINT

The complainant alleged that the Named Employee engaged in biased policing when he issued her an infraction for speeding.

<u>INVESTIGATION</u>

The OPA investigation included the following actions:

- 1. Review of written statement of Complainant
- 2. Search for and review of all relevant records and other evidence
- 3. Interview of SPD employee

ANALYSIS AND CONCLUSION

The evidence from this investigation clearly showed that the Named Employee was unable to see the race or gender of the person driving the car when he obtained a speed check on the complainant's car using his Light Detection and Ranging (LIDAR) device. As an officer assigned to the motorcycle traffic unit, the Named Employee's primary duty is to find traffic violators and issue them citations. Once the Named Employee determined the complainant's vehicle was travelling in excess of the posted speed limit, his job was to stop the vehicle and, in most cases, issue the driver a citation. This was what the Named Employee did and there was no evidence, other than the complainant's allegation, to support the conclusion that the Named Employee's decision to stop and cite the driver was motivated by bias of any kind.

FINDINGS

Named Employee #1

Allegation #1

There was no evidence to support the conclusion that the Named Employee's decision to stop and cite the driver was motivated by bias of any kind. Therefore a finding of **Not Sustained** (Unfounded) was issued for *Bias-Free Policing: Officers Will Not Engage in Bias-Based Policing.*
