July 8, 2021

Reporting Week June 28 through July 4

Week in Review

Due to the holiday and district cleanup recovery, this week the community clean team focused on only one large emphasis area, Myrtle Edwards Park, as well as the various litter and trash pick-up locations citywide. There were 50 additional Clean Cities sites were completed by the Parks Clean Cities Teams and 22 additional sites were completed by SDOT crews. The following summary includes Clean Cities work accomplished by Parks/SDOT Clean Cities Crews.

By the Numbers:

- 1088 needles collected
- 104,340 lbs. trash collected via Community Clean Teams
- 8 blocks of litter pickup by SDOT crews
- 11 miles of vegetation management by SDOT crews
- 489 tents counted onsite
- 1 sign of graffiti cleaned





Clean Cities Emphasis Areas

• Myrtle Edwards Park: 7/1. Volunteer Coordinator Junior Kitiona brought tools, vests, and other supplies to the project. Five volunteers arrived and were eager to work. Downtown Sr. Gardner Julius RayRay started the group off by demonstrating how to properly prune dead branches from trees. The group removed weeds, pruned dead and low hanging branches from strawberry trees and cut new volunteer suckers. The team spread mulch for weed suppression in the shrub beds. The district removed the brush generated from the volunteer project.
