

Project Overview

Project Goal

The goal of this project is to renovate the existing play area space to improve safety and accessibility.

Project Scope

- Replace play area equipment & safety surfacing
- Improve accessibility to the play area
- Add accessible picnic tables, benches, and other site furnishings
- Possible electrical upgrade to improve safety as appropriate

Project Budget

The total budget for the project is \$800,000 for planning, design and construction.

Project Schedule

Planning: Aug 2020 - Feb 2021


• Design: Mar - Nov 2021

Option B: Prospect




Layout preference:










