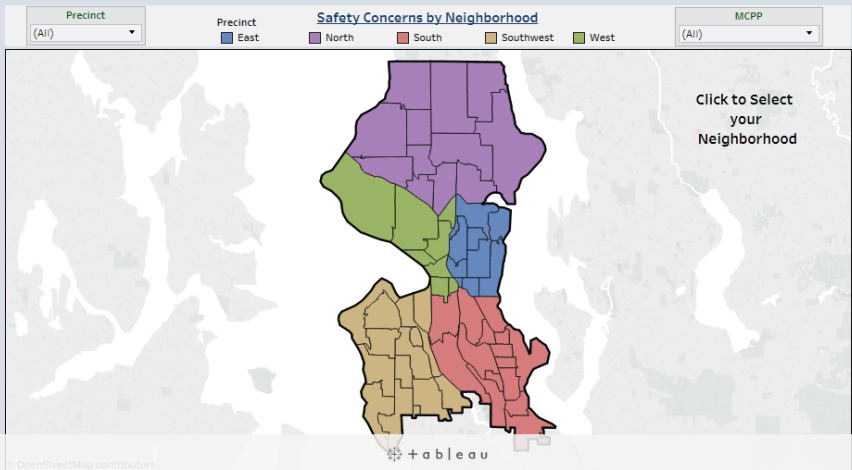
Many of the concerns selected by individuals require the coordinated response of multiple city, county, and state agencies.

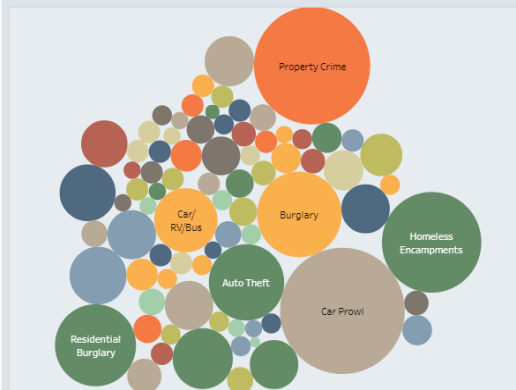


## DATA-DRIVEN What is SPD Doing?

The Seattle Police Department's personnel are working diligently on addressing the priorities of each Micro Community Policing Plan. Every quarter the department will produce a progress report on the department efforts that address the priorities. The information reflects incidents where SPD personnel engaged in proactive crime prevention activities and does not count routine responses to 911 and non-emergency calls for service. The current data represents information collected from April through June 2017.

### Priorities



An essential element of the MCPP process is the collaborative identification, through Seattle University's Public Safety survey results, focus groups, and crime data, of public safety priorities and police service strategies to address the top concerns. Each precinct identifies a lead officer to coordinate the MCPP safety strategy responses, which are updated quarterly, or as needed in specific circumstances. These strategies are then themed as seen below.

As trends and patterns are identified, the relationships established to design the policing plans are reengaged to continually refine the approach. The current themes were updated July 2017.

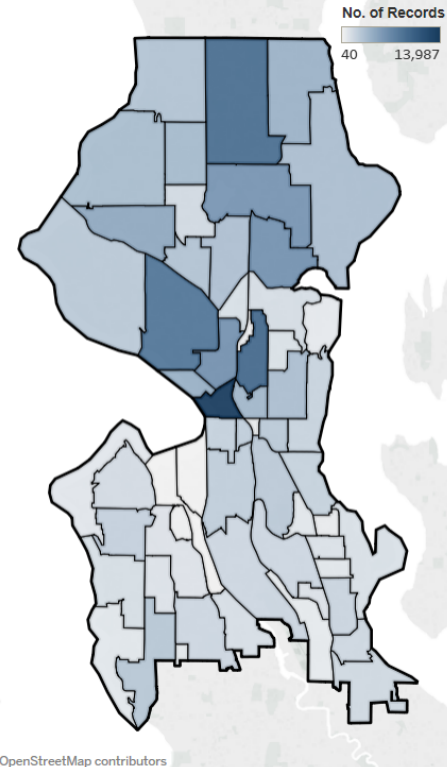
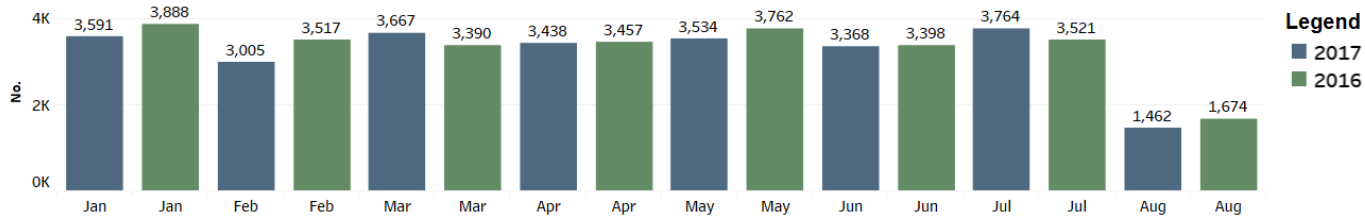

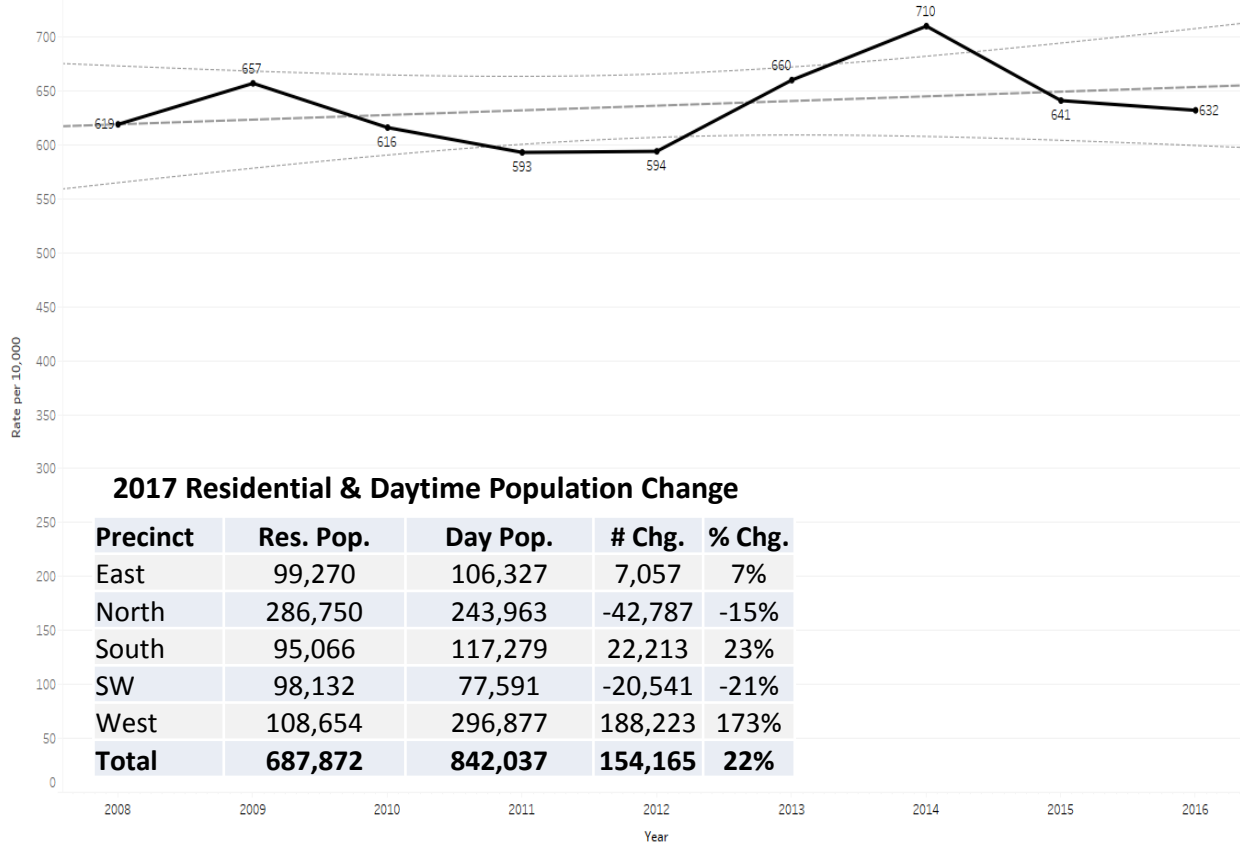


# CRIME RATES

Crime rates are calculated using Esri population estimates and SeaStat crime categories:

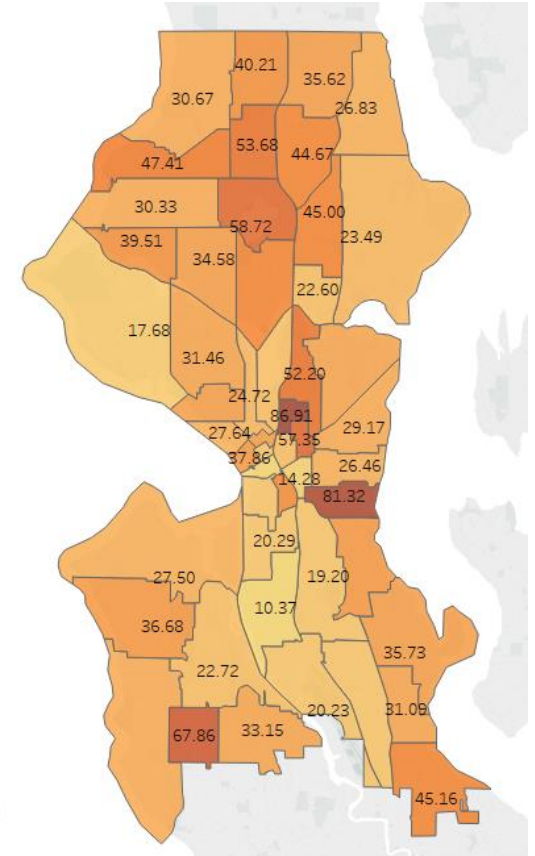

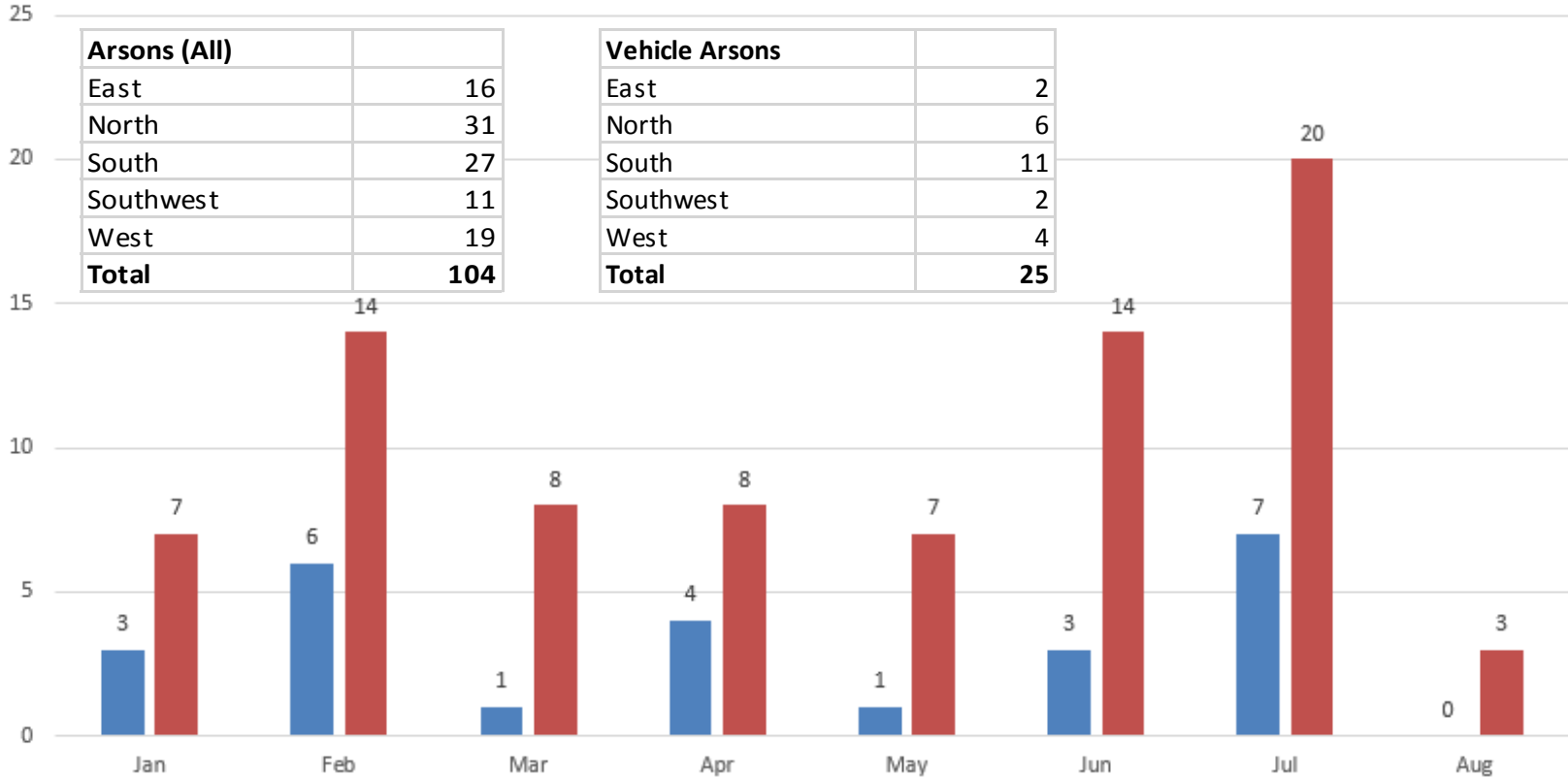

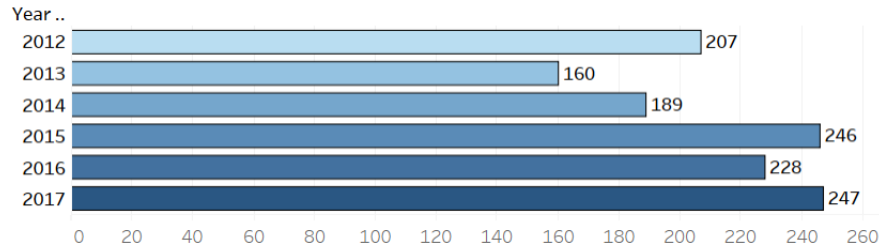

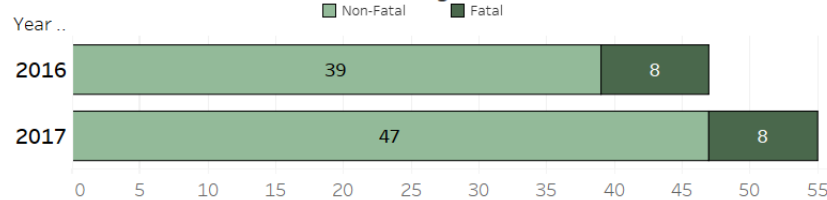

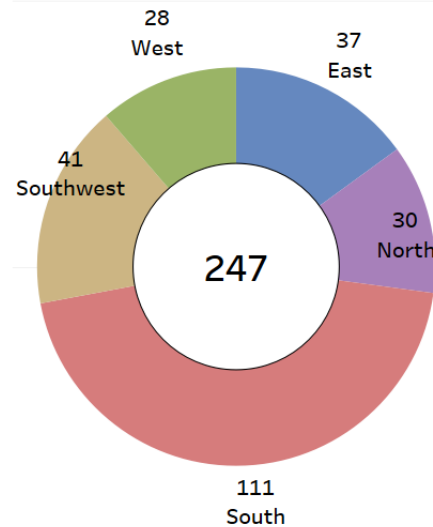
Shots Fired YTD
