







PMP Background

- Plan updated in 2017
- Vision: "Seattle is the most walkable and accessible city in the nation."
 - Goals, objectives, strategies and actions to achieve vision
 - Six performance measure to gauge progress
- Establishes new system for prioritizing ped investments
 - Priority Investment Network (PIN)
 - Proximity to transit and schools
 - Establishes base scoring using safety and health/equity factors




Priority Investment Network

 - Project delivery updates






Prioritization Process


Urban Villages
