

TRANSPORTATION LEVY TO MOVE SEATTLE



AT-A-GLANCE PROPOSAL

The Transportation Levy to Move Seattle is a 9-year, \$900 million proposal to replace an existing levy that expires at the end of 2015. The proposal aims to take care of the basics — maintaining our streets, bridges, and sidewalks — while also investing in the future with improvements that give us affordable travel choices to move more people safely and efficiently in and around Seattle.

Provide safe walking and biking routes to **100%** of our public schools



Complete **50%** of the Bicycle Master Plan citywide network

Build **100** new blocks of sidewalks


Repair up to **225** blocks of damaged sidewalks



Install safe crossings at up to **750** intersections



Repave **250** lane-miles of our busiest streets



Seismically reinforce **16** vulnerable bridges



Create **7** new high-quality bus rapid transit corridors



Complete **7-10** multimodal corridor projects




With partners, create **2** new important freight corridors



Provide **53%** of Seattleites with easy access to a bus that arrives every **10 minutes** or better
