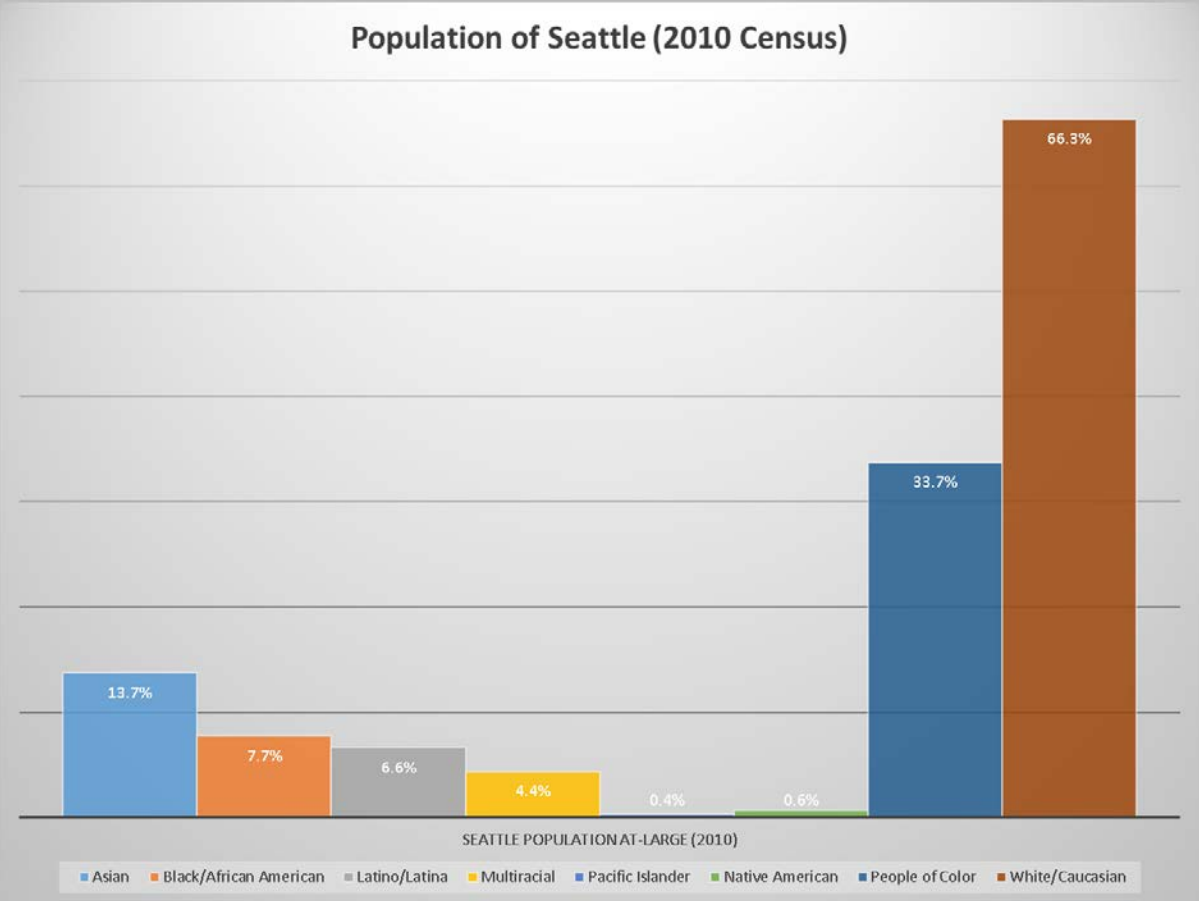

- ENGAGEMENT TYPE AT TIME OF CONTACT

- SERVICES OFFERED
- SERVICES ACCEPTED

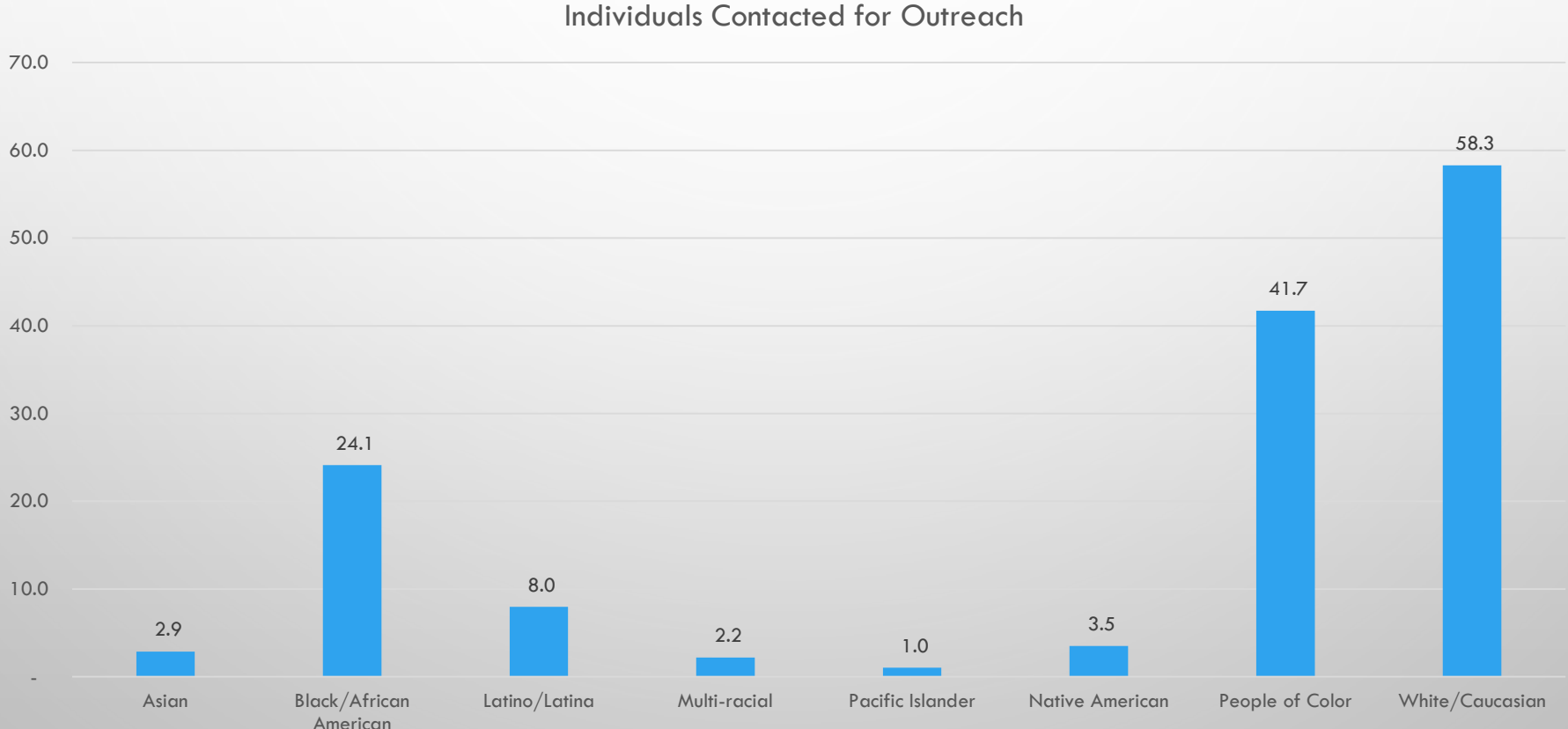
# STORY WE WOULD LIKE TO TELL:

- WHO PEOPLE ARE
- WHERE THEY ARE LOCATED GEOGRAPHICALLY, INCLUDING WHERE AND HOW OFTEN THEY ARE MOVING
- THEIR RACE, ETHNICITY, GENDER AND AGE
- WHAT SERVICES ARE BEING MOST REQUESTED
- REASONS FOR REFUSAL OF SERVICES AND IF THIS IS CONSISTENT
- WHERE INDIVIDUALS ARE OPTING TO GO TO BY: AGE, RACE, ETHNICITY AND GENDER
- AVERAGE LENGTH OF TIME SPENT IN SAFE ALTERNATIVE PRIOR TO DISCHARGE
- REASONS FOR DISCHARGE
- WHETHER WE ARE MAKING THE RIGHT REFERRALS BASED ON DISCHARGE DATA

# TOTAL POPULATION OF CITY OF SEATTLE BY RACE (2010)

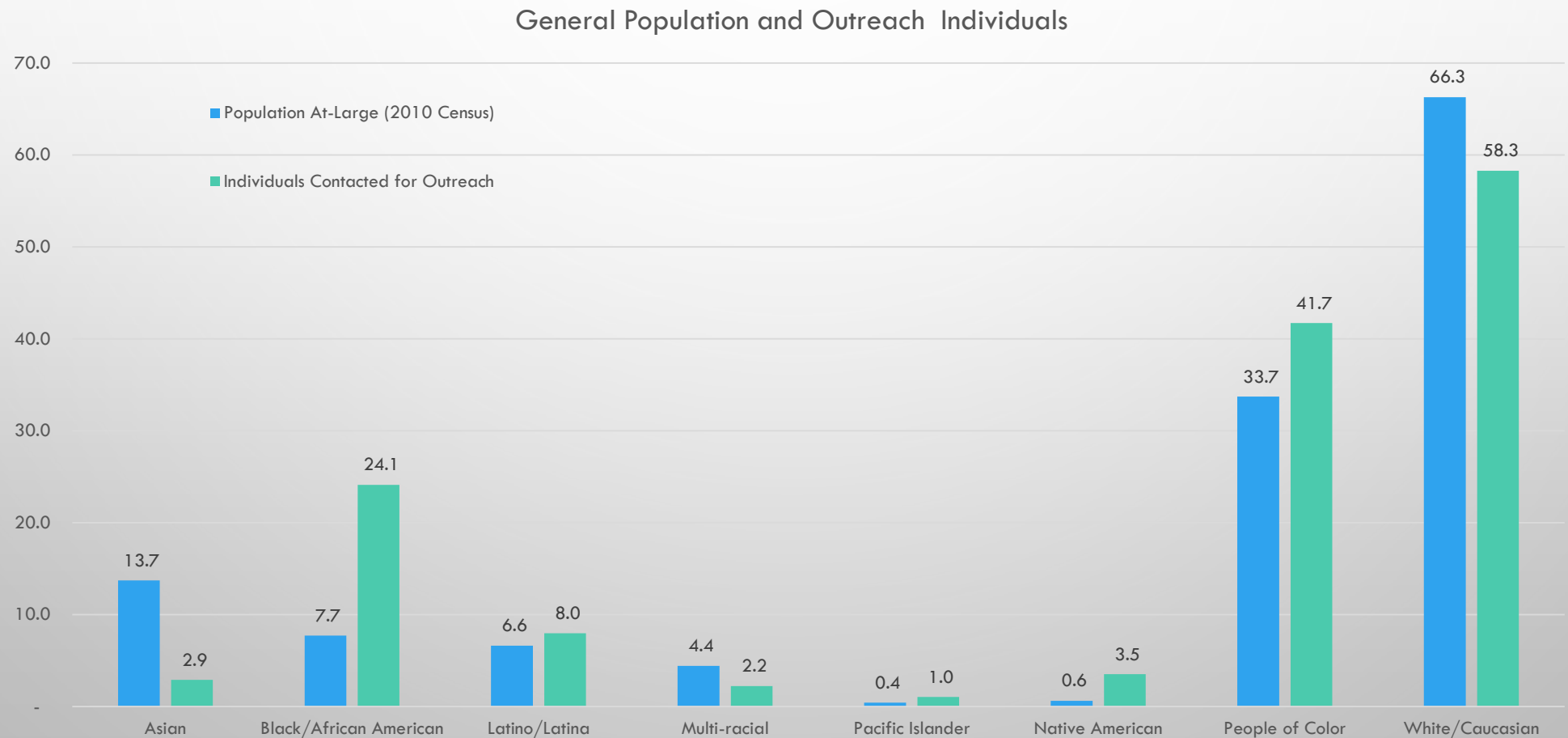


# BREAKDOWN OF NAVIGATION TEAM HOMELESS CONTACTS BY RACE (UNDUPLICATED)



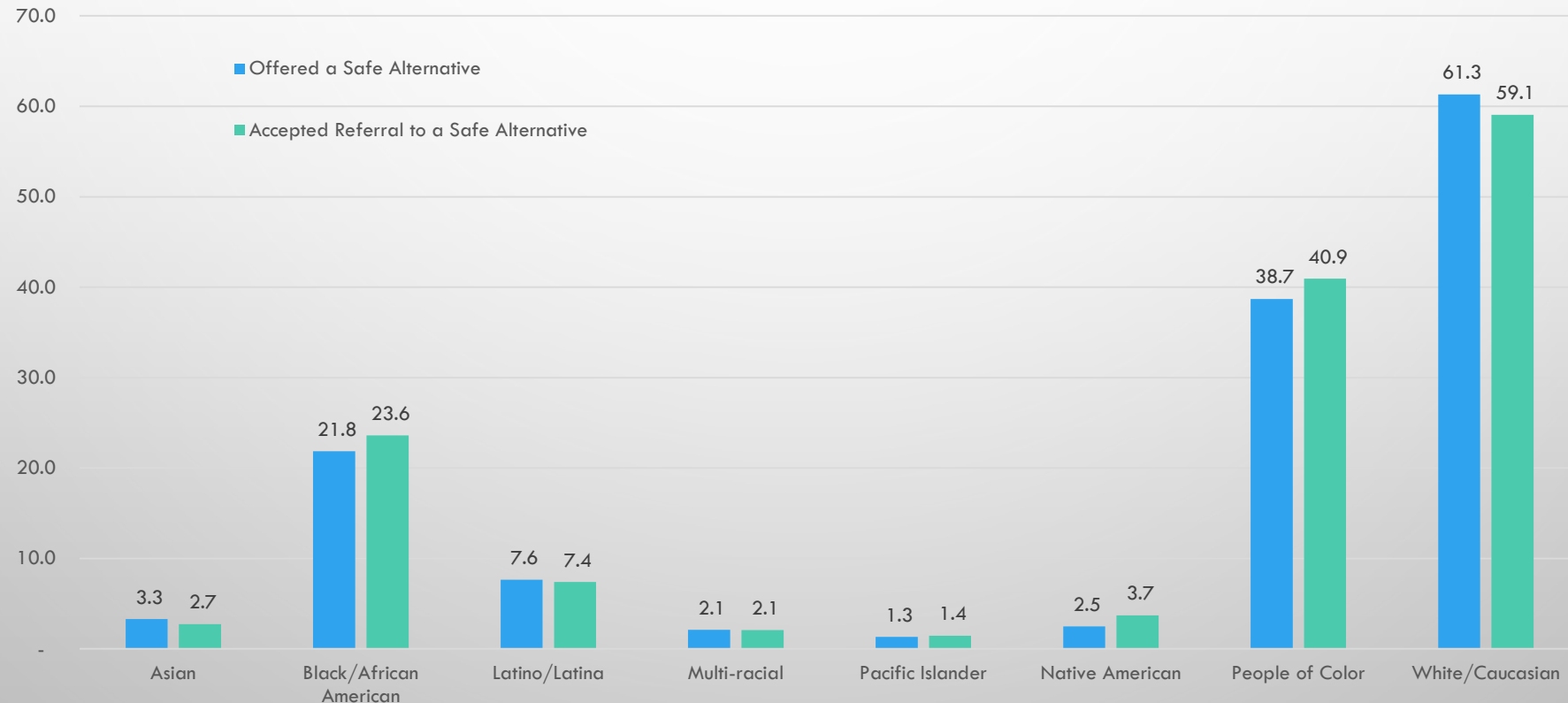

# COMPARISON OF TOTAL SEATTLE POPULATION & NAVIGATION TEAM HOMELESS CONTACTS



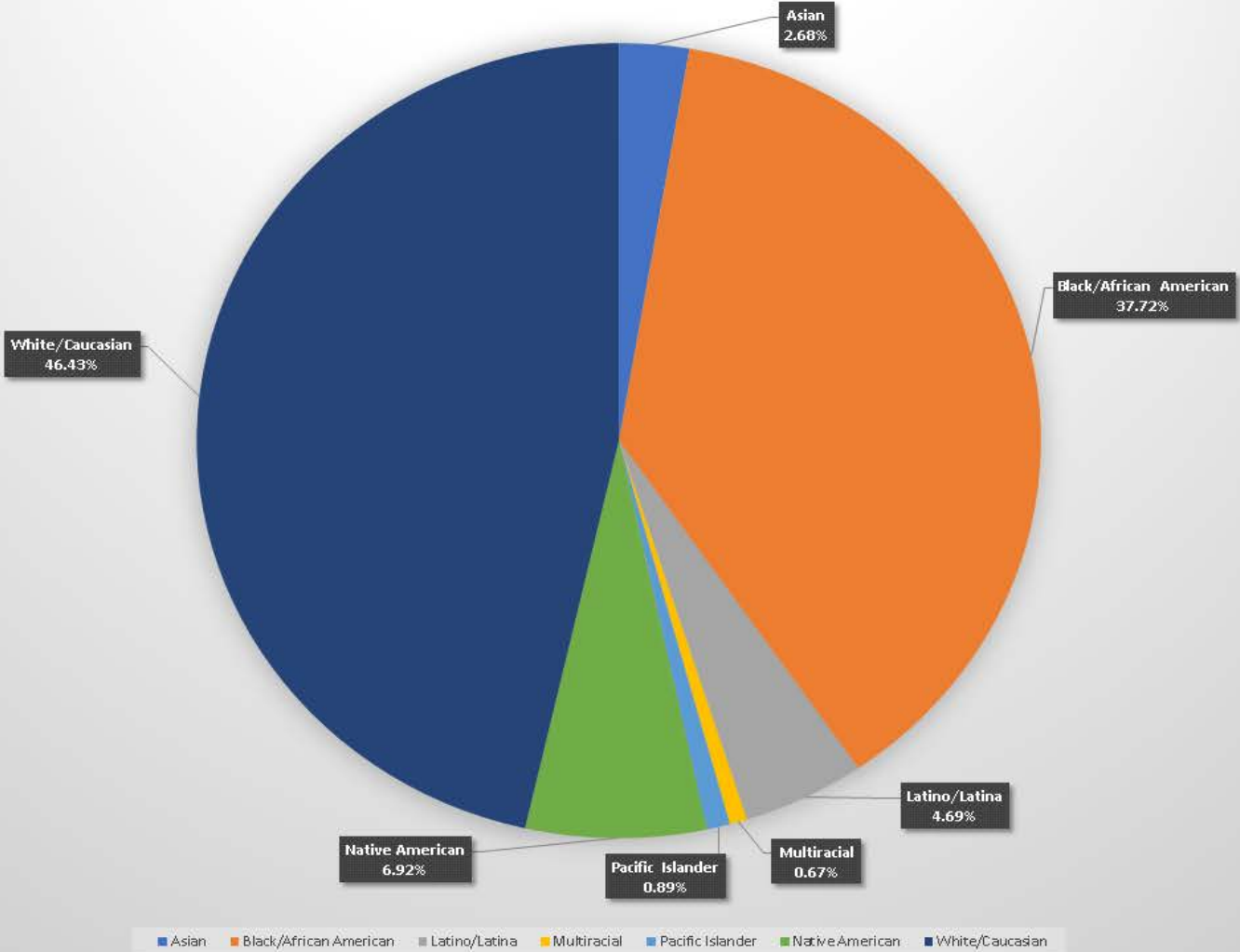
# OFFERS & ACCEPTANCE FOR SAFE ALTERNATIVES BY RACE/ETHNICITY

Demography of Offers and Acceptance



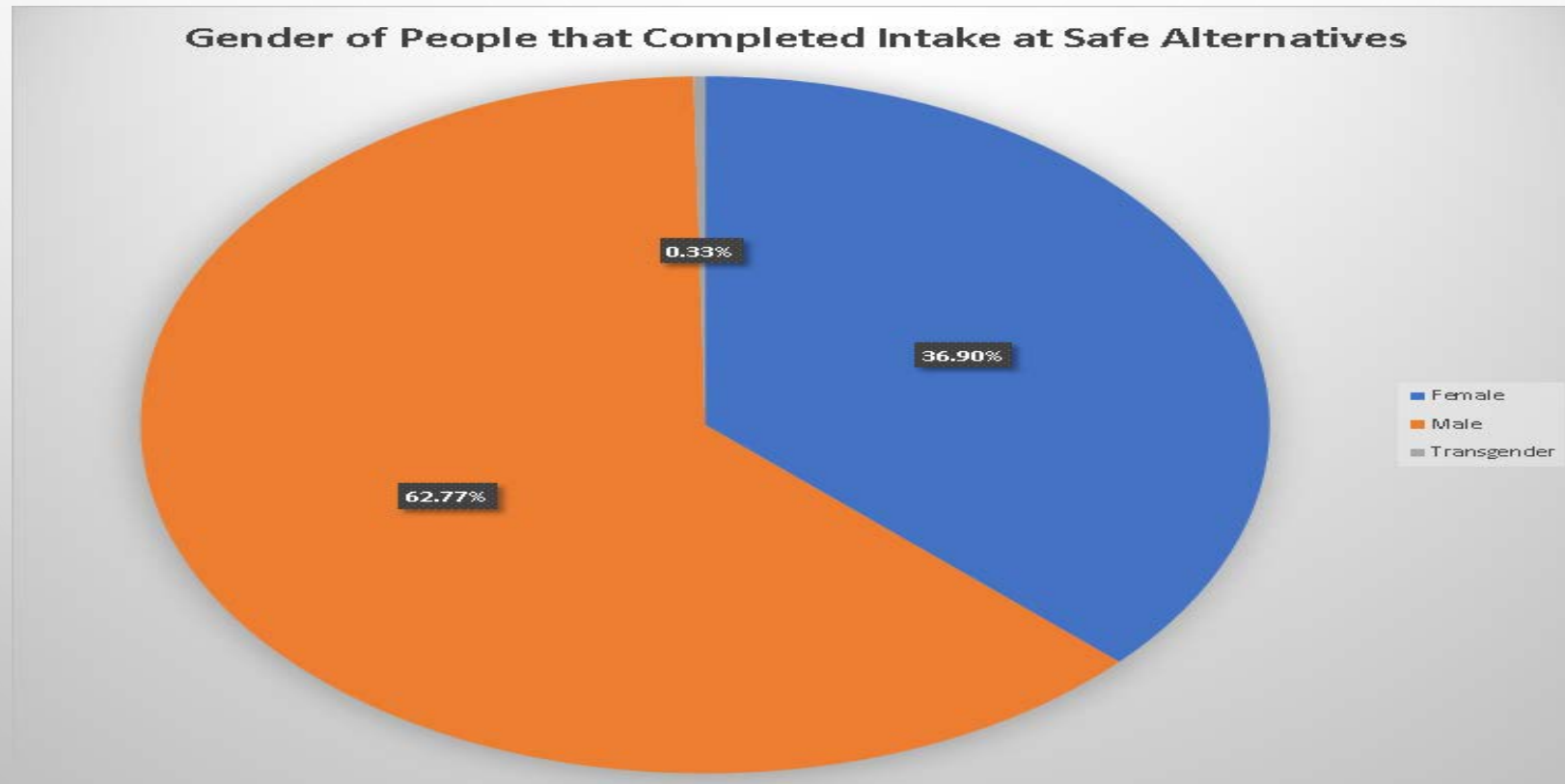
# BREAKDOWN OF VERIFIED INTAKES TO SAFE ALTERNATIVES BY RACE

Record of Showing up at Safe Alternative

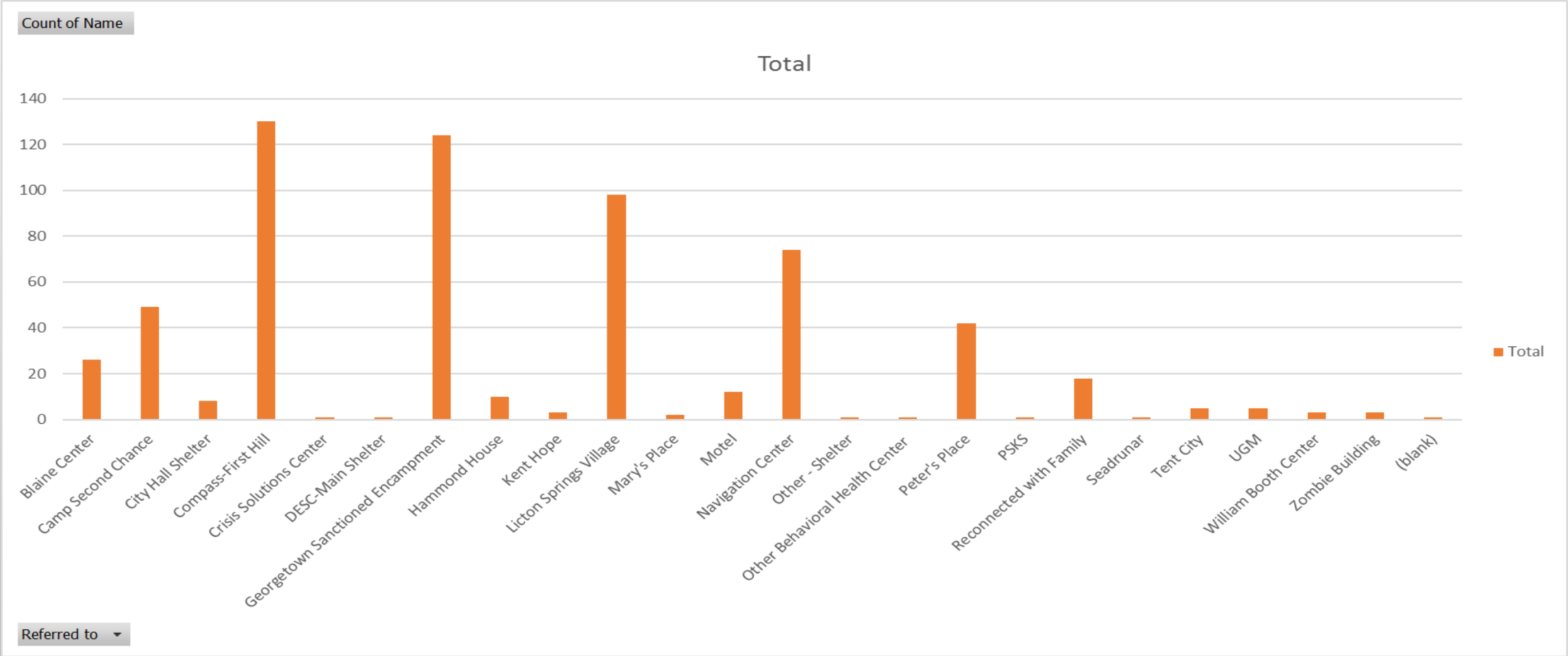




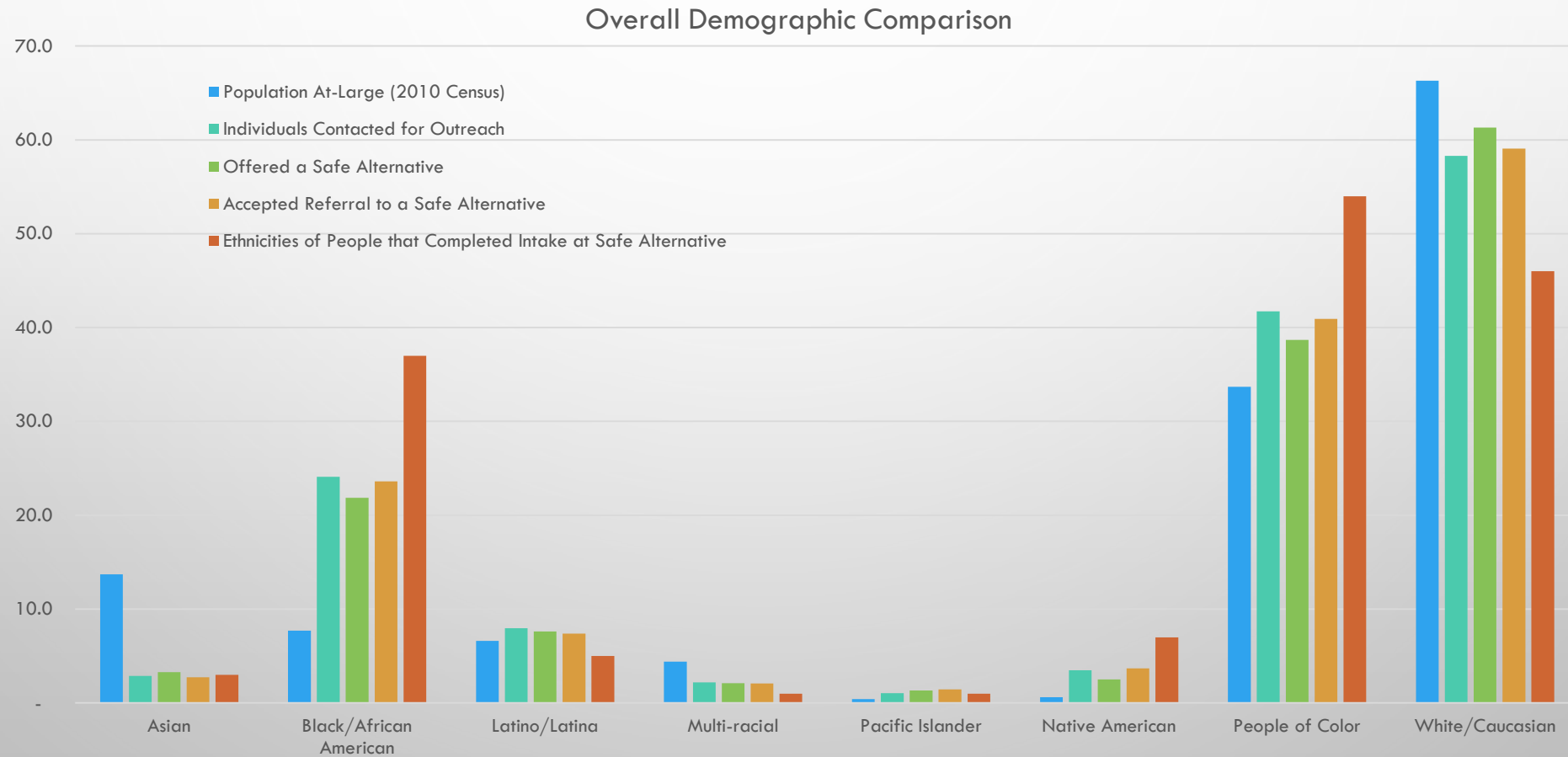
# COMPLETED INTAKES TO SAFE ALTERNATIVES BY GENDER

# DATA COMPARISON INCLUDING: OFFERS, ACCEPTS & INTAKE COMPLETION



# WHAT WE'VE LEARNED:

- 63% OF ALL PEOPLE COMPLETING INTAKES TO SAFE ALTERNATIVES DUE TO NAVIGATION TEAM REFERRALS ARE MEN, AND 37% ARE WOMEN.
- IN PROPORTION TO THEIR REPRESENTATION IN THE POPULATION OF SEATTLE, AFRICAN AMERICANS ARE 3 TIMES AS LIKELY TO BE HOMELESS
- IN PROPORTION TO THEIR REPRESENTATION IN THE POPULATION OF SEATTLE, AMERICAN INDIANS ARE 5 TIMES AS LIKELY TO BE HOMELESS
- CAUCASIANS ARE ACCEPTING REFERRALS AT A RATE PROPORTIONATE TO THEIR HOMELESS POPULATION BUT ARE MORE LIKELY TO NOT COMPLETE INTAKE TO SAFE ALTERNATIVE
- CERTAIN POPULATIONS APPEAR MORE OPEN TO ACCEPTING SAFE ALTERNATIVES:
  - AFRICAN AMERICAN
  - AMERICAN INDIAN
