In honor of Bike Everywhere Month, join Seattle Parks and Recreation for a special community celebration of bicycling and walking in the park.

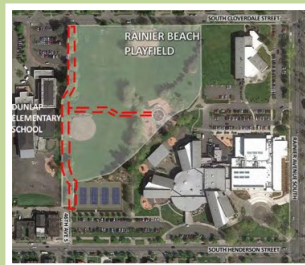
