PROJECT DESCRIPTION

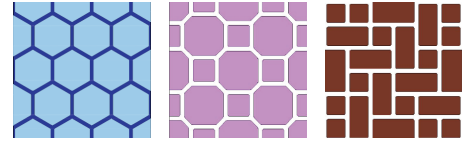
The Interurban to Green Lake Neighborhood Greenway Connection will run along N 83rd St providing a vital link between the existing neighborhood greenway (Interurban North) on Fremont Ave N and the protected bike lanes on Green Lake Dr N. The neighborhood greenway connection will be constructed in coordination with the Aurora Ave N intersection improvements as soon as summer 2020.

A future connection is also planned to connect with the existing 1st Ave NW neighborhood greenway in coordination with a Vision Zero crossing improvement at Greenwood Ave N.

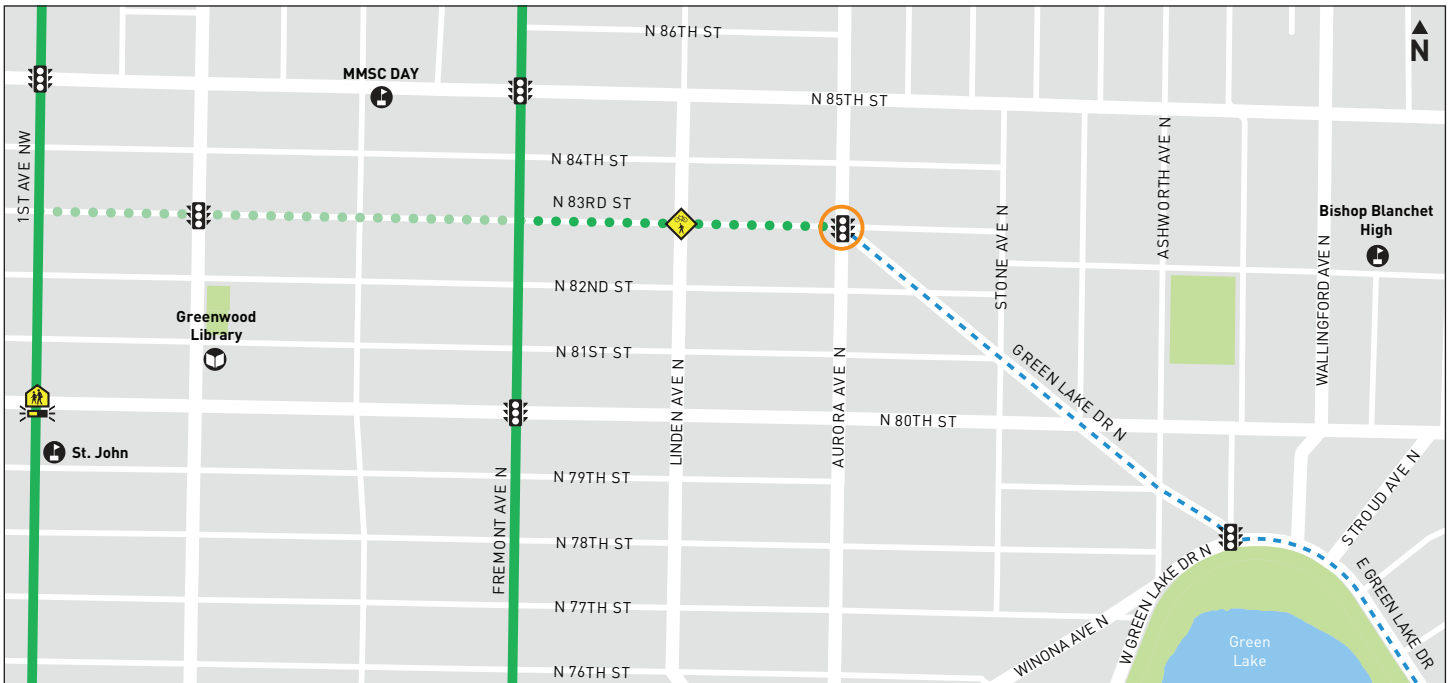
TELL US WHAT YOU THINK
