Neighborhood Engagement Process

- Conducted neighborhood walks in October 2020 to identify specific concerns
- Draft home zone plan presented to South Park Neighborhood Association in November
- Sent out home zone survey to broader neighborhood
 - Translated to Spanish, Vietnamese, Somali, Khmer
 - Distributed through South Park Roots, Community Liaisons, community contacts, social media
 - 233 responses from residents









Who We Heard From




Majority of Respondents live in the Neighborhood

What We Heard

Out of 233 survey responses, about 100 had additional project requests:

- Approximately 60 requests are not feasible in the near term. Many of these were too general like "add lights" or where traffic calming was requested on streets with low speeds.
- 5 requests will be forwarded to SDOT to evaluate for future implementation through Reconnect West Seattle.
- Approximately 40 requests are being accommodated within the existing Home Zone Plan or will be evaluated to see if it can be added to the plan (more traffic counts).


Project Additions

- Additional data collection:
 - S Southern St
 - 12th/Thistle/Dallas intersection
 - S Donovan St (5th to 7th)
- Evaluate sidewalk repair on Dallas Ave S
- Add new curbing and vegetation on S
 Trenton St



Dallas Ave S Traffic Calming

- ~70% of respondents supportive of speed humps on Dallas Ave S
- Remaining concerns with noise and vibrations
- Will explore use of speed tables or speed cushions to reduce noise impacts
- Evaluation of 12th/Thistle/Dallas intersection





14th and Dallas Ave S Update

- Evaluating feasibility of traffic signal to facilitate comfortable, accessible crossing
- Collected traffic data on intersection operations
- Beginning engagement with Parks,
 King County Roads



8th Ave S Trail Update

• Dirt Corps has cleared blackberry bushes and brought in 4 inches of mulch.







Trees by Concord Elementary School

- Determined appropriate/available trees and creating flyer.
- Community outreach early February; plant trees late Feb. early March



Next Steps

• Q1 2021

- ✓ Collect home zone survey responses
- ✓ Present final home zone plan to community
- Design and early project implementation

• Q2-Q4 2021

- Implement priority projects and engage neighborhoods on construction plan
- Continue neighborhood collaboration on long-term improvements
