- The room and AV damage deposits and final rental payment are due one month before the rental. The room and AV damage deposits are fully refundable, unless damage is found or late fees are incurred. Damage will be assessed at \$50 per hour plus materials. You may be charged in excess of \$450.00 if conditions warrant.
- All rentals must end by dusk. \star This fee only applies to 501(c)3 and government organizations.
- Organization must have a mission related to education, cultural history, or the environment.
