- 6. NOVEMBER 2023 CIVIL SERVICE ELECTION UPDATE: Director Scheele gave an update on the Civil Service and Public Safety Civil Service Election for the employee elected commissioner position. Ms. Scheele announced the information sessions were underway and thanked the commissioners for their participation in the sessions. Ms. Scheele notified the commission that postcards were mailed to eligible voters. The election will be held the first week of November and results are expected by November 17th.
- 7. SAVE THE DATE: 42ND ANNUAL CIVIL SERVICE CONFERENCE: Ms. Scheele notified the commission that the Civil Service Conference will be held virtually October 24th through 26th.
- 8. <u>COMMISSION RETREAT:</u> The CSC commission and staff will hold its annual retreat at SMT on October 2nd. Ms. Scheele notified the commission that the agenda is being finalized.

9. CASE STATUS REPORT and APPEALS UPDATE

Director Scheele informed the commission of the current open appeals. The commission reviewed the case status report.

Reichenbach v. SPU, CSC 23-03-002: Director Scheele reported the first prehearing conference for which she would preside has been rescheduled for October 6th.

Sivage v. SDOT, CSC 22-01-014: Director Scheele reported the appeal was delegated to the Office of the Hearing Examiner (OHE). The OHE notified the commission that Ms. Sivage withdrew her appeal, and it was dismissed.

Clemons v. SDOT, CSC 22-01-015: Director Scheele reported that this appeal was dismissed by CSC and referred to the Seattle Office of Civil Rights (SOCR).

10. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR REPORT

Departmental Work and Budget Update: Director Scheele provided an update to the commission on ongoing departmental work and budget. **PSCSC Exams:** Director Scheele informed the commission that staff has ongoing work with the exam unit on hiring and promotional exams with the Seattle Police and Fire Departments. **Budget:** Director Scheele shared she is working on the 2024-2025 budget. There was a possible

inconsistency in the labor expenditures of the department. Ms. Scheele reported she would find out and return with information.

- 11. OLD/NEW BUSINESS: There was no old/new business.
- **12. EXECUTIVE SESSION (MAY BE CANCELLED IF NOT NEEDED):** The commission did not go into executive session.

FIRST ORDER ON PREHEARING **MATTERS**

CSC No. 23-03-002

On Friday, October 6, 2023, at 10:00 a.m., Civil Service Commission Executive Director Scheele presided over the first prehearing conference in this matter. Appellant Amy Reichenbach was present with her representative, attorney Judith Lonnquist. Respondent Seattle Public Utilities ("SPU") was represented by City of Seattle Assistant City Attorney Deborah Fiander.

SUMMARY

1. Jurisdiction and timing of timing of motions to dismiss for lack of jurisdiction.

The parties discussed with the Executive Director:

- a. Whether the Civil Service Commission has jurisdiction over each of the allegations in the appellant's Notice of Appeal and attachments; and
- b. Whether jurisdictional objections are required to be made within a certain number of days of the notification provided under Civil Service Commission Rule 5.06.
- 2. Preliminary witness lists.

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4. Hearing scheduling and prehearing deadlines.

Both parties and their representatives are able and available to participate in a hearing in March 2024. Scheduling of the hearing, filing deadlines, how many days for hearing, and other topics were postponed until jurisdiction questions are resolved.

5. Discovery.

Discussion of this topic was postponed to a later prehearing conference.

6. Prehearing and Post Hearing Briefs.

The parties were informed that they will submit prehearing and post hearing briefs.

7. Dispute Resolution.

The parties are strongly encouraged to engage in mediation or another method of dispute resolution through the Office of Employee Ombud, or any other program that is mutually agreed upon prior to the hearing.

ORDER

The appellant is hereby directed to provide to the Civil Service Commission and respondent no later than 5:00 p.m. on Friday, October 20, 2023, a short summary of each alleged violation alleged in the appellant's Notice of Appeal. The summary is to be provided within a pleading, not in the body of an email.

Regarding what is described above in Section 1.b. of the Summary, a motion to dismiss for lack of jurisdiction, if any, may be filed no later than the deadline that will be established in a future prehearing order. Such a motion may be filed at any time prior to that deadline.
