 street names in the district, would
 indicate a Scotch influence: the high elevation
 (422 ft.) of the area with the view of
 Cascade and Olympic Ranges and
 Mt. Rainier suggest the Highlands of
 Scotland, Thistle is the national flower
 of Scotland, Melrose - a burgh, Trenton
 - the river Trent, Sullivan - of Gilbert
 and Sullivan fame, Cambridge - the
 famed English University, etc.
