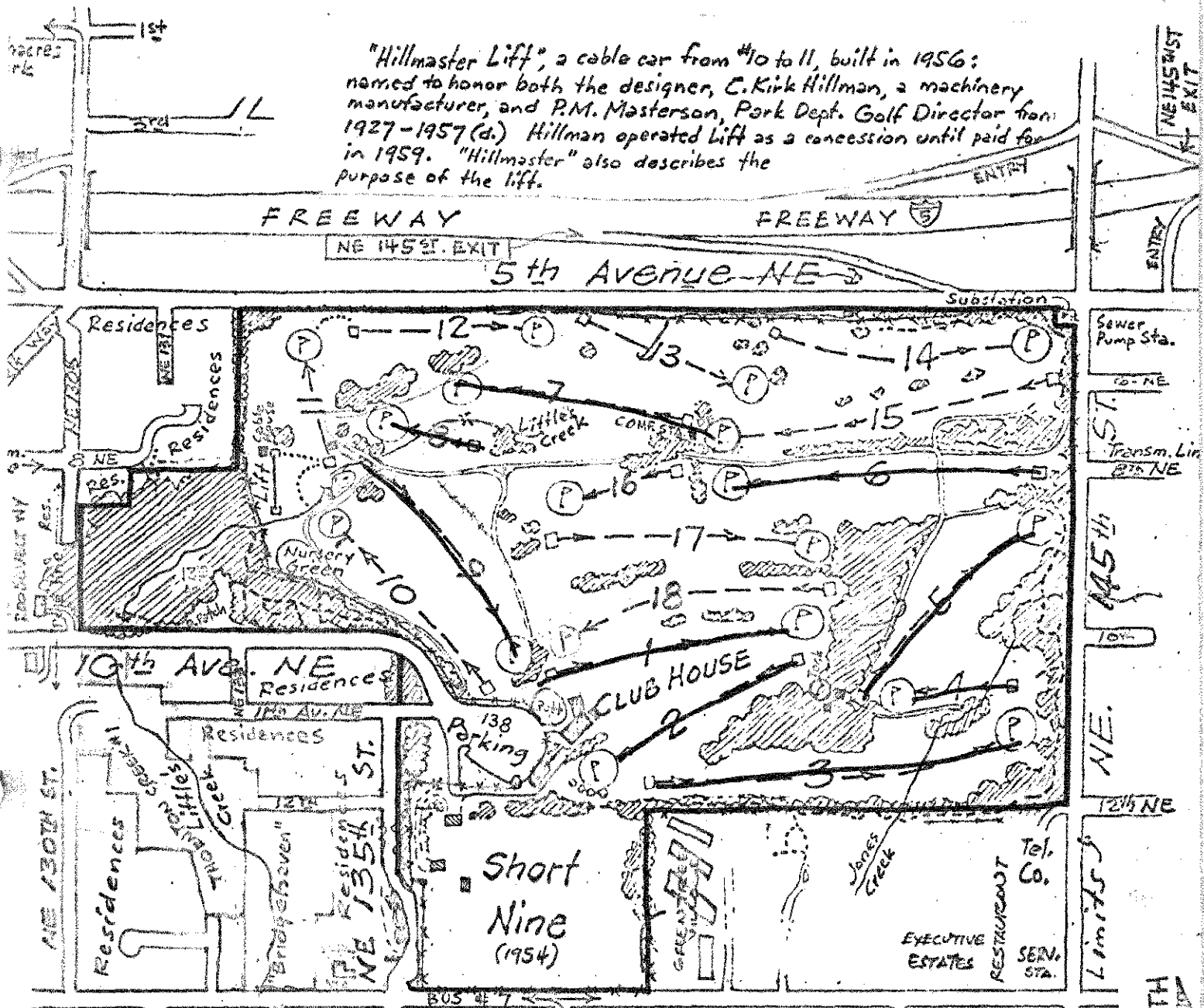


"Hillmaster Lift", a cable car from #10 to #11, built in 1956: named to honor both the designer, C. Kirk Hillman, a machinery manufacturer, and P.M. Masterson, Park Dept. Golf Director from 1927-1957 (d.) Hillman operated Lift as a concession until paid for in 1959. "Hillmaster" also describes the purpose of the lift.



Park acquired thru efforts of golfer + former Park Commissioner James Stirrat. NE

 Many names for the park were suggested, but the Board moved to adopt Dr. Tiffin's recommendation and the Course named in honor of  
 7th President, Andrew Jackson (3/27/30)

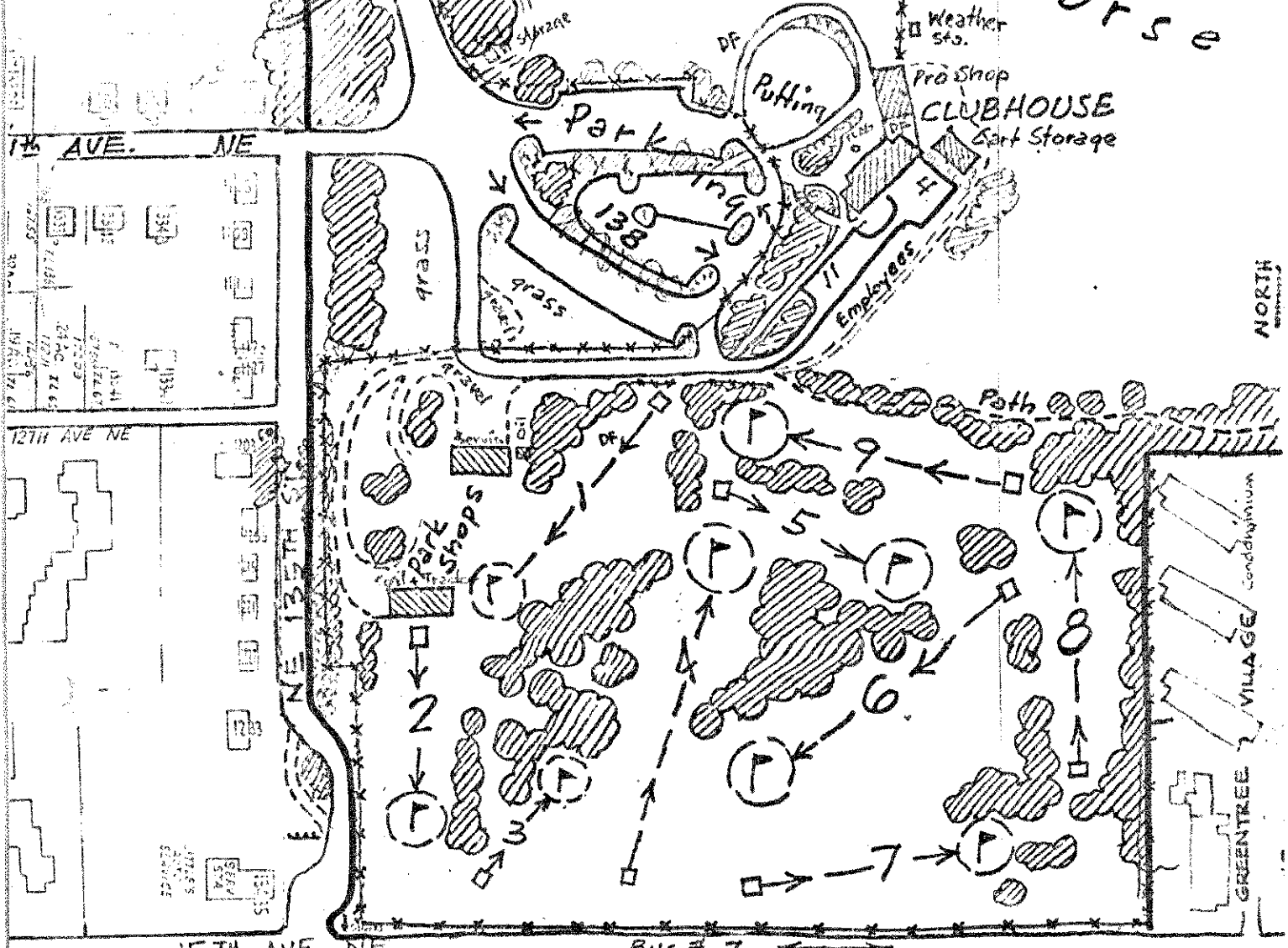
