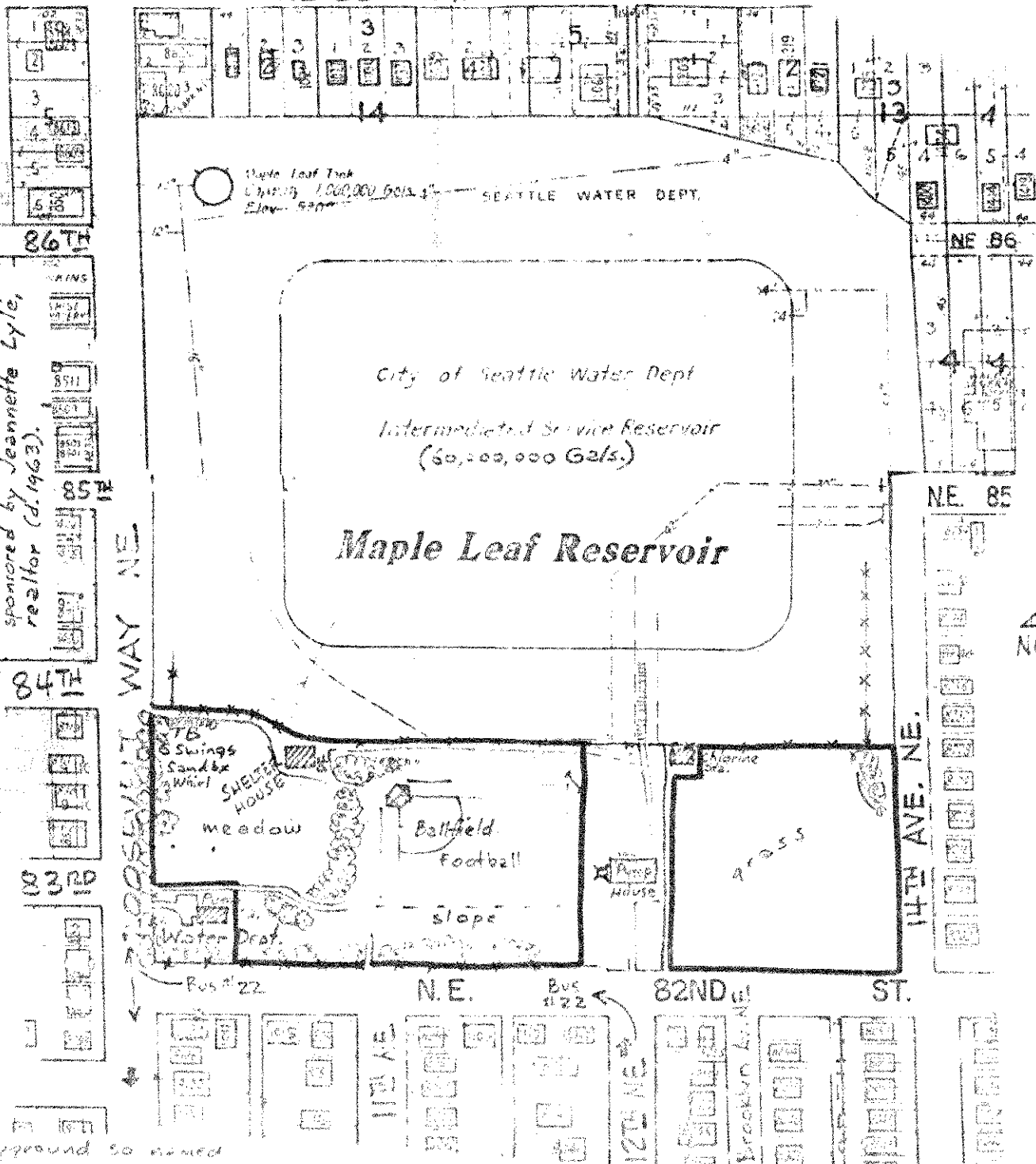


NE 86th St.



by Ordinance on Oct. 30,
1933, to honor Franklin D.
Roosevelt, 32nd President;
sponsored by Jeannette Lyle,
realtor (d. 1963).

Playground so named
because it was transferred
from "reservoir" property.
Reservoir name derived
from the district in which
it is located; plot was
dedicated as "Maple Leaf
Addn to Green Lake Circle." (1888)
(In 1894 the Maple Saw Mill
was located east of here, on
the shore of Lake Washington
- now site of Matthews Beach.)
(Henry Vonasselt married Catherine
Maple in 1862)
[Maple Valley named in 1880's due to
presence of Vine Maple trees.]
