Seattle Center Seeks Candidates for Positions on the Central Waterfront Oversight Committee

[Waterfront Seattle](#) is a series of large-scale capital projects that is remaking Seattle's Central Waterfront. As we close in on the final year of park design and construction, the creation of more than 20 acres of new and rebuilt waterfront parks and public spaces, known as Waterfront Park will be fully open to the public by 2025.

Waterfront Park is an urban high-quality park that serves the city and region, with a focus on arts, culture, and recreation programming to serve Seattleites as well as visitors.

The Central Waterfront Oversight Committee (CWOC) is a 20-member mayoral/council appointed and confirmed Committee that oversees Waterfront Park performance in relation to maintenance, programming/activation, and public safety.

The CWOC was established in 2019 by Ordinance 125761 and developed the Waterfront Performance Standard, which is a tool used to evaluate the City and Friends of Waterfront Seattle on high quality park maintenance and operations. Committee members conduct park inspections, as well as review data related to key performance metrics and provide feedback to the City and Friends on any desired adjustments to be made in the park.

A Local Improvement District (LID) was established for certain portions of Waterfront Park and the CWOC includes representation from LID ratepayers, as well as key stakeholders/partners, and the larger downtown community.

The current open positions are:

- (1) At Large Community Representative (City Council appointed)
- (1) LID Residential Apartment Tenant (Mayor appointed)
- (1) LID Owner of an Office Property (City Council appointed)
- (1) LID Owner of a Commercial/Retail Property (City Council appointed)

Commission meetings are held Quarterly, and as needed and conducted with a virtual and in person option. Commission members generally must commit approximately 2 hours per month to Commission business and serve without compensation.

Applications are due by **4/5/2024**. The City of Seattle is committed to promoting diversity in the city's boards and commissions. Women, persons with disabilities, sexual and gender minorities, young persons, senior citizens, persons of color, and immigrants are encouraged to apply.
