I currently sit as a member of the LGBTQ Commission Community Advisory Committee, were we discuss and advocate for the needs of housing, adequate healthcare and more. In the past year I have been able to solidify our Federal 340B program that has already brought in an 400K to our organization.

I am particularly excited about the opportunity to contribute to the regional workforce housing initiative. This is a great step in addressing the housing issue in our community, but more work needs to be done to ensure accessible housing for all of our community members, including those who are unable to work. I am excited to dive into conversations on how we can protect and center the needs of our most marginalized as it comes to issues of transportation and environmental sustainability.

I would be honored to serve as a Council Member and to work collaboratively with fellow leaders and community members to continue improving our city.
