CPC Policy Brief re SPOG

The CPC received the SPOG contract late evening on Monday, October 1 and has analyzed the contract to identify how it aligns with or departs from the police accountability ordinance enacted by the City in 2017. Judge Robart has order a Status Conference, which has been rescheduled to November 5, 2018, and has invited parties to submit a briefing on the following topics:

- 1. The process and timeline by which the TA will be finalized;
- 2. Next steps in the event the TA is not finalized;
- 3. The parties' preliminary positions on whether the TA complies with the terms and purpose of the Consent Decree;
- 4. The point at which the court should review any agreement between the City and SPOG to ensure compliance with the Consent Decree, and the process for such a review.

The brief which will be submitted by the CPC has been draft and discussion was held regarding the content.
