#### IV. Office of Independent Investigations (OII)

- Introduction and Updates: Executive Director Grant welcomed and introduced staff of the OII.
- Director of OII: Roger Rogoff
- > OII is working to hire staff and begin setup work of the office.
- > OII is a completely independent office.
- > Mission: "Conduct competent, thorough, and compassionate investigations done

with an anti-racist lens and done with as little bias as possible."

- Starting July 1<sup>st</sup>, 2022, OII can begin investigating cases of police use of deadly force across the state.
  - Have had some initial start up delays due to staffing.
- Purview: investigate new use of force cases (criminal cases only) + review of old investigations and procedures taken.
- OII has family liaisons that act as victim services to keep families connected to OII and informed about investigation process/steps/updates/results/etc.
- OII recommends that the state legislature creates an Office of Independent Prosecution to handle the cases that OII makes criminal referrals for.
  - OII in conversation with Governor and Attorney General regarding.
- Issue with legislation that created OII: if a police department is under a federal consent decree, the OII is not able to investigate said department.
  - Hoping to work with legislature to rectify this.
  - If legislature does not fix, OII will work with SPD to work around hinderance.
- The ED will connect CPC staff with OII staff for further conversations around engagement, updates, and opportunities for work overlap.
