The Community Police Commission to hold a community meeting and teach-in about the proposed police contract

The Community Police Commission is hosting a community meeting and teach-in about the proposed police contract. While a council vote on the contract may be imminent, this will be the first public meeting to discuss the contract.

We'll be sharing our research on the ways the proposed contract fails to implement key police accountability legislation reforms passed just last year. It was passed by an 8-0 vote of the city council with broad community support. We'll also be asking the community where we should go from here.

This is an official Community Police Commission meeting.
