## **Eligible Applicants**

1. If I want to start a in home childcare can I apply for this grant to re open at another location even if I have to go back through the licensing process?

No, this grant is for any agency under contract to provide preschool services for the Seattle Preschool Program (SPP) or the Pathway Program.

2. I saw that there is a grant available for Family-based childcare providers (FCCs). I am in the process of opening a family in-home daycare however I need assistance in starting my child care. I did start the process through DCYF however I need a bigger home and I do not have all the funding for that. I know with this grant it states "Start new facilities, either from the ground up" Can I still apply for the grant and how do I go about this if I don't have the facility or home to do my daycare? please provide me with any information.

  - Can we apply for this grant directly for the June 20th application as new providers? we are starting our business now we want to open a facility and we noticed that this grant can be used for start-ups
  - What licensing do we need before applying for this grant? We are a new start-up and wanted to get all of our licenses after hopefully getting a grant.

This grant is for any agency under contract to provide preschool services for the Seattle Preschool Program (SPP) or the Pathway Program.

An agency must already be under contract with DEEL to provide SPP or Pathway services to apply for this grant.

Are we still eligible to apply for our new construction early learning center/preschool project at the new site?

An agency under contract to provide preschool services for the Seattle Preschool Program (SPP) or the Pathway Program is eligible to apply for the facilities funds RFI.

#### **Program Requirements**

- We are a FCC with SPP contract located in NE Seattle and would like to apply for this grant. We realize
  that we might be too late in the game to apply/ request for Pre-Development Services Program to be
  connected with one of the architects. If not please do connect us with one of them. We were thinking
  of the following, so please let us know if this would be feasible to apply for
  - Replace our current wooden fence (3 sides) and gates surrounding the entrance and exit of
    our program. the current fence is leaning at certain places and there are gaping holes in the
    lower half of the fence in certain places which our neighbor's dog and poke it's head through.
    For security purposes we would also like to install a numerical electronic locking system on
    the gates so only parents who have this password can enter or exit the gate leading to the
    childcare space.
  - Install playground equipment that is installed into the ground
  - Install a canopy so children are protected from rain or sun while playing outside

Please let us know what the expectations would be for funding the above-mentioned project.

An agency should not expect City funds to reimburse expenses accrued **prior** to executing a funding agreement with DEEL.
