We request the principal's signature as they are ultimately responsible for all activities that occur in their school building particularly during out-of-school time that the assistant principal may not be aware. 5	<p>Question(s): Can you address all 3 program areas in a single proposal?</p>	<p>Answer(s): Yes. The cover sheet requires that you identify a primary program area, but you can choose to identify a secondary area. 6	<p>Question(s): What can you tell us about obtaining a letter of support from a principal?</p>	<p>Answer(s): A formal letter of support is not required as part of your application submission, however, principal signature is most important if your program is intending to be located on a school campus.</p>	3/14 TA Session	3/17
7	<p>Question(s): What about a letter of support for a program that is coordinated at the district level but housed in a particular school?</p>	<p>Answer(s): Though a letter of support is not required as part of your application submission, it would be best in this circumstance to provide a letter of support from the district person coordinating this programming. 9	<p>Question(s): We do a lot of surveying of our participants, are you saying you'd rather we do it through DEEL and add our question rather than an independently?</p>	<p>Answer(s): There are three ways to approach this: first is that DEEL would create the survey and add your survey prompts to it, then provide you with the data once the survey is administered. The second is that you would create and administer the survey, which would include DEEL required questions, then provide the survey data to DEEL. 10	<p>Question(s): And the other evaluative piece is that you'll be doing site visits, not program officer focus groups?</p>	<p>Answer(s): Yes, we will be conducting site visits but if there are focus groups happening and you would like to invite us to observe as a part of that site visit, that would be fine. 	Regarding student attendance metrics: say you had a 4 week program and a kid was going to be gone 2 weeks out of those 4 on vacation, would your students served metrics capture that and not penalize a program?	We have two measures, the first is the number of students enrolled, regardless of attendance, and the other is the number of students attending 50% or more. We want students to be attending as much as possible but we also want to recognize that not everything about attendance in summer programming is under your control.	Session	
13	Question(s): Just flagging that the institutional partnership FERPA waiver is signed by a principal, so summer programming not overseen by a principal may require an alternate process. 14	Question(s): We noticed the program requirement in the RFI overview that states summer programs must take place for a minimum of 15 hours per week. Our organization will be offering 4 simultaneous 8-week program sessions in different Seattle locations-- each session takes place for 9 hours per week. Since this adds up to 36 hours/week across the multiple programs, would we be eligible for funding?	Answer(s): The 15 hour per week requirement is intended to mean that participating students will receive at least 15 hours of programming per week. Combining simultaneous sessions across the city that serve different groups of students does not meet the minimum requirement for funding.
