3	<p>Question(s): We are interested in applying for funding for to replace flooring at our facility. The project is already in process and will be completed in June/July this year. Would costs incurred in June/July 2024 be eligible for reimbursement should our project be selected and meet the requirements below? (Is there a start date for reimbursing costs once contracts are complete?)</p> <p>Project Costs Prior to Signing an Agreement with the City</p> <p>Any agency applying for funds under this RFI bears the risk of all project costs incurred prior to executing a funding agreement with the City. An agency should not expect City funds to reimburse expenses accrued prior to executing a funding agreement with DEEL. Notwithstanding the foregoing, project costs incurred by an agency prior to execution of a final funding agreement may be eligible for reimbursement under the agreement if (i) the project is selected through this RFI, (ii) the project meets all requirements of this RFI, including prevailing wage requirements, and (iii) funding will ensure completion of the improvements for use in SPP.</p>	<p>Answer(s): You may submit an application, but the project is only eligible if it supports SPP.
