

# DVP UPDATE FOR CAMPAIGNS #3

February 21, 2023

***This campaign update was sent by email.***

Good afternoon Candidates and Campaign Professionals,

As you may know, today vouchers are being delivered to the post office. Today also marks the first day all campaigns can go out and start collecting vouchers with Campaign Replacement Forms (attached). Campaigns may also post Campaign Replacement Forms on their websites but please ensure the "Signature" portions are modified to be "Drawn-in" only. If not, they will be rejected by King County Elections and your campaigns will not receive those funds.

Please remember that only the candidate and their named campaign representatives are allowed to collect Democracy Vouchers, of any kind. Additionally, a person cannot be compensated when collecting Campaign Replacement Forms per Rule 16-J.

Additionally, this last point was not covered in the trainings with some of you, but the new ruling (Rule 16-J) also states, "collectors shall disclose their role in writing via a conspicuous and legible sign, placard, or badge stating, 'DV campaign replacement form collector for [Candidate].'"
