WHAT WASHINGTON STATE'S FILM SECTOR HAS TO DO WITH TRADE

Washington state's motion picture and TV industry directly employs 8,500 workers and pays them \$348.5 million in wages. The report also found that Washington state's film industry consists of 2,150 industry-related businesses, which employ more than 37,600 people. Those statistics were released late Monday by the Motion Picture Association of America in an attempt to persuade the U.S. Senate to pass Trade



Promotion Authority legislation, which gives the president greater authority to more quickly submit trade agreements to Congress.
