Report and Summary of Activities

There were significantly less people at the location than the previous day. Some 20 people were present at the location, most of whom were in some state of packing up their belongings to move.

Report and Summary of Activities

A total of 34 individuals were counted at this location. In addition, some 3 bedrolls, 8 structures, and 36 tents were counted.

Writer (Jackie St. Louis), SPD Navigation Team Officers (3), later joined by Lt. Jason Verhoef, and Jeff Horan performed outreach and engagement with encampment residents. REACH team lead Brenda Frazier advised that the site east of I-5 and Dearborn in the roundabout/across the street from the old Nickelsville had not been outreached. There were some 7 individuals in that location. A Mr. Francis Hicks who is well known to Jeff Horan and reported leader of this community, reported that he would have that location cleared out by morning.

During outreach, the encampment residents were generally understanding and reported that they would be moving. Outreach engaged with the individuals, making offers of the resources at their disposal. Those included: 5 Co-ed Salvation Army/City Hall shelter beds; 3 Male Compass/peter's Place shelter beds; 1 Male Compass/Blaine Center bed; 10 Male Salvation Army/Zombie Building beds; 5 DESC/Roy Street Shelter Beds; 1 Georgetown Tiny house.
