Proposed art frame and mural installation

Gage Hamilton explained the art frame and mural installation were a continuation of the program which has already installed many murals in the district.

ARC/ Staff report: Ms. Nashem said the Board has approved similar frames and artwork in various locations in Pioneer Square. The Board approved the installation of frames with approval of the initial artwork with staff to review future rotating artwork assure any artwork is not signage. The applicant is asking for the same kind of approval for this installation. This location on the Globe building alley façade is a location where there was prior approval to install bolts for routing art installations. This project proposes to not use the existing bolts but to leave them in place as the proposed size of the artwork is not the same size as the proposed artwork. They proposed to provide new attachment points.

Ms. Elenga noted there were no concerns or questions and that the board appreciated the program.

Action: I move to recommend granting a Certificate of Approval for installation of art frames for rotating artwork. The artwork will be reviewed by Historic Preservation Staff prior to installation of the artwork for compliance with regulations. The frames are to be installed in mortar joints only with bolts that fit the mortar joints. When the frames are removed, the penetrations will be filled with mortar to match existing mortar. The frames should be removed if the program to rotate artwork ends.
