LANDMARKS ARC BRIEFING

PARK ORIGINAL DESIGN INTENT:

- Strong rectilinear concrete forms contrast with soft organic plantings and moving water
- Concrete planters are broken up into multiple forms that slide past each other and create a sense of playfulness, transforming large expanses of concrete into sculptural elements. This is emphasized with board formed concrete finishes that alternate between horizontal and vertical orientations.
- Furniture including seating and waste receptacles are permanent features of the park incorporated into concrete walls and planters rather than separate furnished elements and are softened with natural wood finishes.

DESIGN GOALS:

- Improve way finding
- Improve the safety of the park
- Increase programming and activity throughout the park to attract new visitors.
- Provide buildings that support events and activities
- Respect the original design intent and features of the park



- + Community posting board








SENECA PLAZA DESIGN APPROACH:

- Activate the top of stairs to increase the security of the park
- Provide restrooms, storage and concierge space that will support added programming
- Providing an unassuming architectural intervention out of the way of daily life and significant park features
- Referencing historic board formed concrete walls with a modern interpretation using durable yet contextually appropriate materials





UPPER LAWNS DESIGN APPROACH:

- Existing building that continues the language of intersecting rectangular forms
- Smooth concrete rather than formed concrete differentiate this building from the rest of the site
- Simple one-story form, elevator and restroom uses are expressed as separate intersecting masses















UPPER LAWN FLOOR PLAN






CONCRETE PAVING





Plain concrete (no color). Lightly exposed aggregate surface finish.



Sawcut control joints and score joints.

EXISTING CONCRETE WALLS





Plain concrete (no color).

Board form finish sides, vertical and horizontal orientation.


Troweled finish tops.






As-cast finish sides on some elements (e.g. benches and Upper Lawns building).

NEW & REPLACED CONCRETE WALLS



New / replaced concrete walls at original walls: **Match existing finish** (board form finish sides, lightly exposed aggregate top).

New concrete retaining walls, new locations: **As-cast finish** with single board reveal, lightly exposed aggregate top.

CANYON ACCESS



UPPER SENECA

- 1. New accessible path to overlook.
- 2. Canyon plinth extension.

SENECA PLAZA

- 3. New walk and stair into Canyon.
- 4. Replaced plinths / walls.

CANYON ACCESS





- 1. Add accessible path to Seneca Plaza overlook.
- 2. Add plinth extension slab to meet 42" requirement.





CANYON ACCESSIBLE PATHS MODIFICATION







- 1. Replace grass with contrasting concrete infill.
- 2. Replace non-original concrete infill to match.


SITE LIGHTING



Lighting Approach


- REPLACE fixtures at original mast light locations (original element)
- NEW fixtures at new and existing pedestrian pole locations (non-original element)
 - **REPLACE** fixtures at existing wall and stair locations (not shown).
- NEW colored lighting in 8th Avenue underpass (tunnel)


