2024 Annual Work Plan review

Indigenous Peoples' Day review

 Workgroup members provided an update on IPD planning. CANOES and UIATF will receive funding for IPD programming. The IAC will coordinate centralized marketing through an event poster and social media content that can be shared by community and Tribal partners.
 2024 is the 10-year anniversary of IPD in Seattle.

Bylaws amendment

 Members reviewed and passed a bylaws amendment discussed at the May retreat. The amendment adds a role for two members to serve as spokespeople for the IAC.
