Seattle Preschool Program Levy Goals

RFI page 3

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- Ensuring children are prepared to enter school
- Helping to close the achievement and opportunity gaps by providing high quality early learning opportunities to Seattle's 3and 4-year-olds

RFI Information

- Competitive process with no guarantee of funding
- Must submit RFI Application to receive funding
- Two types of applications:
 - o SPP
 - SPP Pathway

SPP:

- 2015-16 school year for SPP: 14 classrooms, 280 children
- Funding amounts will vary depending on # of children served, teacher credentials, and other available revenues

SPP Pathway:

Funding amounts based on a cost per slot based on 5 tier achievement levels

SPP and SPP Pathway Contracting:

Performance-based contract

SPP and/or SPP Pathway

- SPP and SPP Pathway Applications have different minimum qualifications
- A Proposer can apply for either the SPP or the SPP Pathway, or both
- Proposers can be on the SPP Pathway for up to 2 years

SPP Minimum Qualifications

Seattle Preschool Program:

- Licensed by the WA State Department of Early Learning (or exempt from licensing)
- Must be enrolled in Early Achievers (EA) <u>and</u> hold a rating of Level 3 or above
- Newly-hired teachers must meet SPP teacher education requirements; current teachers will be given 4 years to meet education requirements

SPP Pathway Minimum Qualifications

RFI pages 4-5

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SPP Pathway:

- Licensed or able to become licensed by the Washington State Department of Early Learning (DEL) by September 1, 2016 (or exempt from licensing)
- Must be able to enroll <u>and</u> begin participating in Early Achievers (EA) within 3 months of contract execution or within 3 months of becoming licensed
- Teachers must meet SPP Pathway education requirements

High Need Locations (55 Points)

- Sites physically located in areas where Seattle Public Schools (SPS) elementary schools have records of low academic achievement **OR**
- Sites not physically located within the priority attendance areas but have a 5+ year track record showing that at least 40% of their preschool enrollment consists of children who matriculate to Title I or Level 1 and Level 2 schools.

(Note: Proposers can fill out one application for multiple sites; however, individual sites will be scored separately.)

Serving Low Income Children (25 points total)

- Provides ECEAP, Head Start, and/or Step Ahead Preschool (13 points)
- Provides Extended Day Care (12 points)
 - Child care from 7:00 am 6:00 pm year-round, including summer when preschool is not in session

Evaluation Criteria, Cont'd.

High Quality Practice (10 points total)

- Rated as an Early Achievers Level 5 with the following CLASS scores (5 points):
 - o 6.0 for Emotional Support
 - o 6.0 for Classroom Management
 - 4.5 for Instructional Support

*If Proposer is unable to provide written documentation of CLASS Scores, the City will obtain them from DEL with Proposer's permission

Provides Dual Language Classroom (5 points)

Narrative Section* (20 total points)

- Experience serving diverse groups (10 points)
- Experience engaging families (10 points)

*Narrative question responses cannot exceed 300 words for each question

Tiebreakers (6 total additional points)

- Agencies operating preschool classrooms within the attendance area of a public school where English Language Learner population has exceeded 30% of the total school population within the past three years (2 points)
- Agencies that have the capacity to provide comparatively more classrooms for SPP in comparison to other applicants (2 points)
- Agencies operating preschool classrooms within the attendance area of a public school where the percentage of incoming kindergarteners in the attendance area has increased by more than 10% over the past two years (2 points)

Evaluation Criteria (SPP Pathway Application)

Only one evaluation criteria differs between SPP and the SPP Pathway:

- High Quality Practice (5 points)
 - Proposer is <u>registered</u> in Early Achievers and participating in Level 2 activities. Proposer does not have to be EA rated to receive full points

Response Requirement:

- 2015-16 Seattle Preschool Program Preschool or SPP Pathway RFI Application (Exhibit A) and required application items listed on checklist at end of <u>Application</u>
- Exhibit B (<u>only required if applying for SPP</u>): Information to Calculate Expected Provider Reimbursement
- All narrative responses within the 2015-16 SPP or SPP Pathway RFI Application
 must be limited to 300 words per question. Any responses exceeding this limit
 will be excised from the document for evaluation purposes.
- Narrative responses must be in this format:
 - 8½" x 11" paper, minimum size 11 font, 1-inch margins
 - o Typed or word-processed; double-sided, single or doubled spaced
 - o Pages numbered
 - All attachments stapled together
