Why are we doing this project?

- Thomas Street is the busiest pedestrian corridor at Seattle Center and the place of first impression for many visitors.
- The retail along Thomas Street is aging and needs a refresh.
- Underutilized spaces including the Armory southern plaza offer opportunities for better placemaking, wayfinding, and accessibility.
- Other projects in the area are in concept/early design and should be integrated into a cohesive whole:
 - Seattle Center Monorail Station (new ADA compliant ramp at main entry)
 - Thomas Street Retail Opportunity (currently Expressly Northwest gift store)
 - Remodels and additions being considered by Seattle Center partner organizations

- A street that helps unify the Seattle Center campus.






Street Network






Stormwater

- Consider opportunities to create place with stormwater features.





Theatre Commons Plan (2010)










Theatre Commons Template





20'-0" unit paving

- Herringbone pattern holds up to vehicular traffic.
- Standard width for emergency vehicle access.
- Option for permeable surface with open joints.



6'-9" tree and furniture zone

- Permeable material supports long term health of trees.
- Location for event tents spaced between street trees.




3'-0" concrete bands

- Provides edge for adjacent paving and planted areas.
- Mounting surface for bench seating.
- Location for large light pole and other






Street Alignment

Intersections:


Introducing intersections at key nodes along Thomas Street allows for alignment shifts and width variations while maintaining overall street continuity and integrity.





Shift Street Alignment at Armory:


Recognized as the amenity hub of the Seattle Center campus, the Armory is the preferred location for the street alignment shift.






Conceptual Gateway - Painted Intersection








- Add energy and interest to the area and complement the existing mix of attractions already at Seattle Center.





Existing Armory Plaza Section




Armory Proposed Armory Plaza Section Key Plan: NTS ARMORY 78'-9"


