

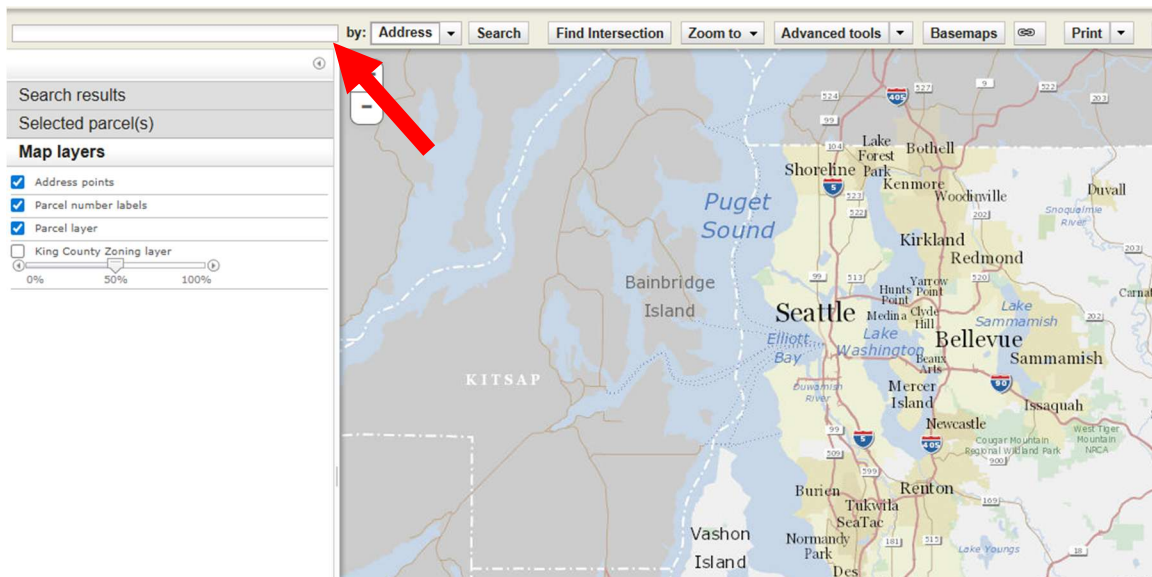
Seattle Area Heat Pump Rebates

Heat pumps are an investment in your home and there are many programs out there to help make it possible! The specific programs and offers can change based on where you live, the type of fuel you currently use, and household income. This flyer helps identify rebate programs applicable to you.

Important Note: There may be more rebate programs available to you, and this list is not meant to be comprehensive. Please check each program’s webpage for up-to-date funding availability, eligibility information, and application processes.

To check your legal jurisdiction:

City of Seattle:

These programs apply if you live within the Seattle jurisdiction.

Program: Clean Heat

Existing Fuel Type: Oil

Income Requirements: None

Offer: A base \$2,000 rebate for converting from heating oil to a qualified heat pump. If you are income-qualified, you could get a bonus \$4,000 rebate as well. See website for income guidelines.

Program: HomeWise Weatherization

Existing Fuel Type: Oil, Gas, Electric Baseboard

Income Requirements: Yes, see website

Offer: Full cost coverage to replace your existing heat system with an energy efficient heat pump system. In addition, you can get energy efficiency upgrades to your home to make it more comfortable.

Seattle City Light:

These programs apply if you get electricity from Seattle City Light

Program: Home Energy Solutions

Existing Fuel Type: Any

Income Requirements: None

Offer: A \$300-\$600 rebate off qualified heat pump systems. Incentive goes to your contractor and they pass on the savings to you on the invoice.

Program: Ductless Heat Pumps

Existing Fuel Type: Electric Baseboard

Income Requirements: Yes, see website

Offer: Full cost coverage to replace your existing heat system with an energy efficient heat pump system. In addition, you can get energy efficiency upgrades to your home to make it more comfortable.

Puget Sound Energy:

These programs apply if you get natural gas from Puget Sound Energy (PSE).

Program: Efficiency Boost

Existing Fuel Type: Gas

Income Requirements: Yes, see website

Offer: \$4,000 off a qualified heat pump system if you are switching from a gas furnace

King County:

These programs apply if you live in King County jurisdiction but could include other parts of South King County. See program websites for more detailed information on eligibility.

Program: Energize King County

Existing Fuel Type: Oil, Gas, Electric Baseboard

Income Requirements: Yes, see website

Offer: Full or partial cost coverage (depending on income) to replace your existing heat system with an energy efficient heat pump system. In addition, you can get energy efficiency upgrades to your home to make it more comfortable.

Shoreline:

These programs apply if you live in Shoreline city limits. Please note that Shoreline residents likely get electricity from Seattle City Light, so could qualify for those programs as well.

Program: Energize Shoreline

Existing Fuel Type: Oil, gas

Income Requirements: None

Offer: A \$2,500 rebate on qualified heat pump systems installed by a qualified contractor.

Program: Energize Shoreline – Full Cost Coverage

Existing Fuel Type: Oil, gas, electric baseboard

Income Requirements: Enrollment in Seattle City Light's Utility Discount Program, Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program, or Shoreline Wastewater District's utility assistance program.

Offer: Full cost coverage on qualified heat pump systems installed by a qualified contractor.
