### **Process**

- Day 1: When a request to sign onto a letter is received, Co-Chairs and staff assess for alignment with support areas. If aligned, then Co-chairs identify subject matter experts on the GND Oversight Board
- Day 2: The whole Board will be sent a notification email that also indicates who the Executive Committee has identified as subject matter experts.
- Day 3-4: Co-chair consultation with subject matter expert(s)
- **Day 5:** Co-chairs approve and sign statement
- Next GND Oversight Board meeting: Brief the Board

### **Primary Support Areas:**

- 1. Supporting Building Emissions Performance Standards (BEPS) policy and implementation
- 2. Home weatherization and converting homes away from fossil fuel to clean energy for low- to moderate-income households
- 3. Investing in climate ready, community serving facilities (e.g. resilience hubs)
- 4. Ensuring a portion of the Payroll Expense Tax (PET) is allotted for climate justice investments
- 5. Support for workforce development and opportunities in climate careers, including maintaining the Climate Workforce Development Advisor Position
- 6. Resourcing community leadership to develop and implement climate solutions (e.g. EJ Fund, indigenous climate led initiatives community assemblies, etc.)
- 7. Support for urban ecosystem restoration and greening strategies
- 8. Low carbon pilot projects
