ORDER DENYING APPELLANT'S REQUEST TO FILE UNTIMELY APPEAL

PSCSC No. 15-01-023

On December 31, 2015 the Appellant emailed the Executive Director requesting to appeal the Seattle Police Department's final disposition (File #15-0374). Appellant acknowledged to the Executive Director that he was beyond the 10 day filing period provided in the Public Safety Civil Service rules but wanted to request that the Commissioners accept his untimely appeal. The Commission heard the Appellant's request at the Commission's regularly scheduled meeting on January 21, 2016. Respondent was represented by Amy Lowen, Assistant City Attorney. Appellant was not represented.

After hearing from Appellant and reviewing the documentation he and the City provided, the Commission has questions about the Seattle Police Department's handling of student officers with regards to notifications of discipline, name clearing hearings, and appeal rights. The Commission plans to direct those questions to the Department.

However, the Seattle Municipal Code, SMC 4.08.100 (A) states that an employee "may within ten days from the date of service of such statement, file with the Commission a written demand for a hearing." By the Appellant's own admission, he did not comply with this deadline. While the Commission may waive the requirements of its own rules per PSCSC Rule 6.17, the Commission does not have the authority to waive requirements under the Seattle Municipal Code.
