Sail Sand Point: Building 11 & 31 Construction Update

Seth Muir, Executive Director of Sail Sand Point, delivers a presentation on the status and planned future construction at Sail Sand Point's Building 11 and Building 31 premises.

Muir responds to questions from MPAC members about traffic and parking considerations, and about outreach to SPR's tribal partners.

Friends of Magnuson Park aims to open a Sand Point historical display inside Building 406, hoping to open for tours by the end of summer 2026.

MPAC members provide updates on the status of the Magnuson Park Pickleball Project.

Magnuson Community Center Report

Jarod Okano, Magnuson Community Center Coordinator, gives a report on ongoing programs and upcoming events. Okano also provides updates on capital projects, including work on MCC's gym handrails and ADA lift. Okano details updated protocols guiding City of Seattle staff interactions with federal law enforcement.

MPAC members and Okano discuss City training and signage regarding federal law enforcement access to City buildings.

Magnuson Park Manager's Report

Joanne Orsucci, Magnuson Park Manager, delivers the report. Orsucci notes that the Seattle Animal Shelter (SAS) will be holding pet vaccine clinics in Hangar 30 beginning this month.

MPAC members discuss committee membership and recruitment.

New & Old Business

King encourages all MPAC members to bring concern from constituent groups to MPAC meetings and/or to email King prior to meetings.

MPAC members discuss community safety concerns, including ongoing issues of street racing in and around Magnuson Park. Members note that phone calls to SPD often result in long wait times and require caller to remain onsite for hours to meet with officers, which has dissuaded several members from making reports of racing to police.

King notes that he will be absent in April and asks for volunteer to co-chair that month's MPAC meeting.

King adjourns the meeting at 7:29 PM.
