Victor Steinbrueck Park Renovation PUBLIC MEETING

Seattle Parks and Recreation invites the community to participate in a public meeting for Victor Steinbrueck Park renovation. This meeting is an opportunity to learn about the project and provide input on the renovation. Seattle Parks and Recreation planner, David Graves, and design firm, Walker Macy will present the proposed project and answer community questions.

The 2008 Parks and Green Spaces allocates funding to improve Victor Steinbrueck Park public safety including but not limited to improving sight lines into the park, renovating seating, renovating the former children's play area, improving and expanding lighting, and upgrading landscaping. In addition the park sits atop a privately owned parking garage. The membrane between the westerly portion of the park and the parking garage below is failing. A complete replacement of the membrane will be necessary as part of any improvements to the park.

Seattle Park and Recreation's design team will gather input and work with the community to prioritize park improvements. Seattle Parks and Recreation has been and will continue to be engaging organizations including the Chief Seattle Club, the Friends of Market, surrounding residents and businesses and homeless advocates regarding the park. We encourage the community and park users to attend and participate in the planning. Seattle Parks will gather community feedback at this first meeting and then present design concepts at a second meeting in September with a final design for the new park in early 2017.
