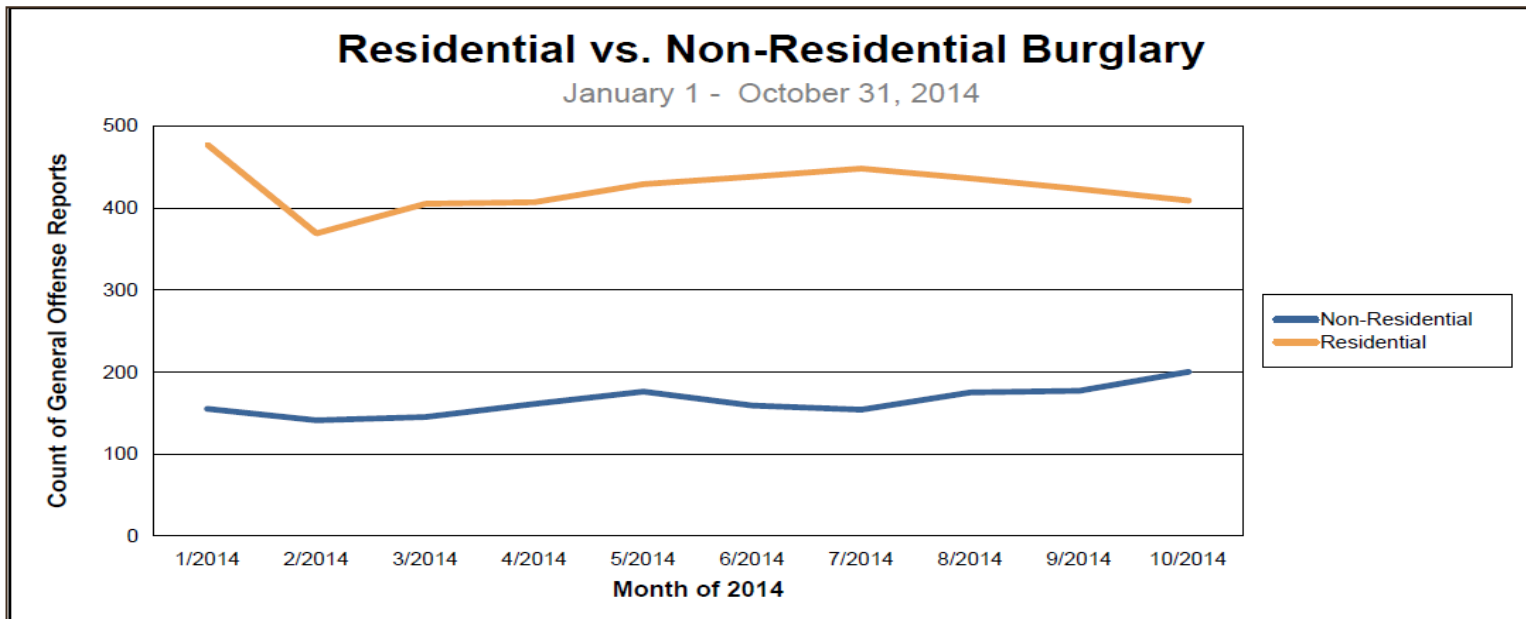

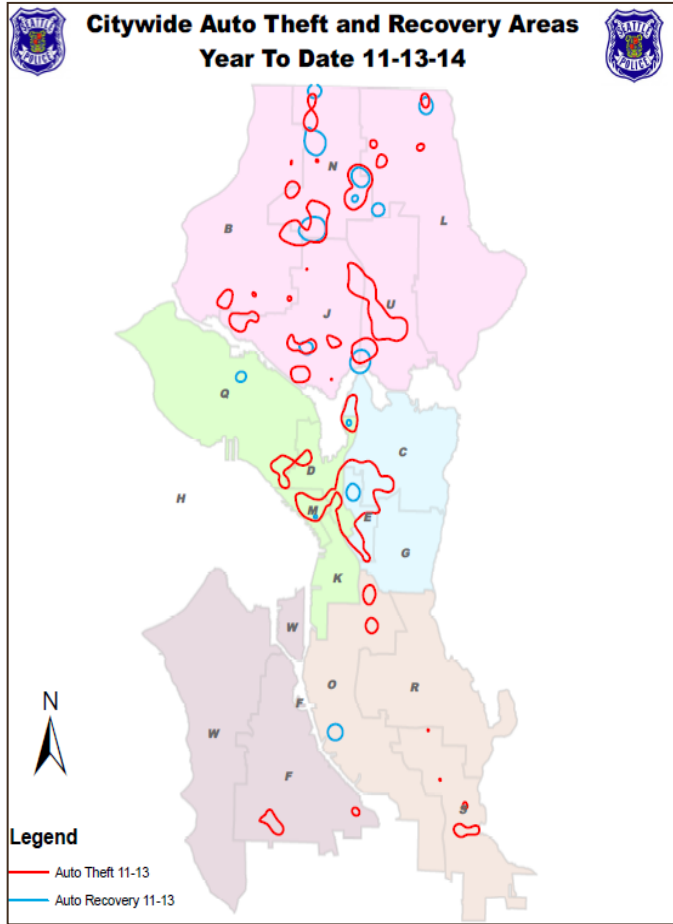
Citywide Burglary: Residential vs Non-Residential

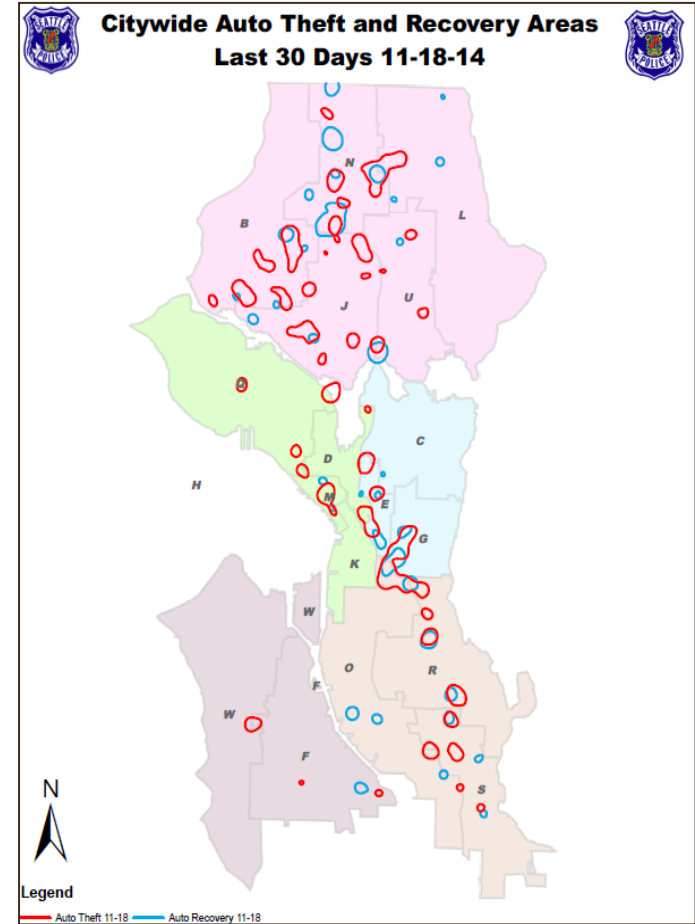

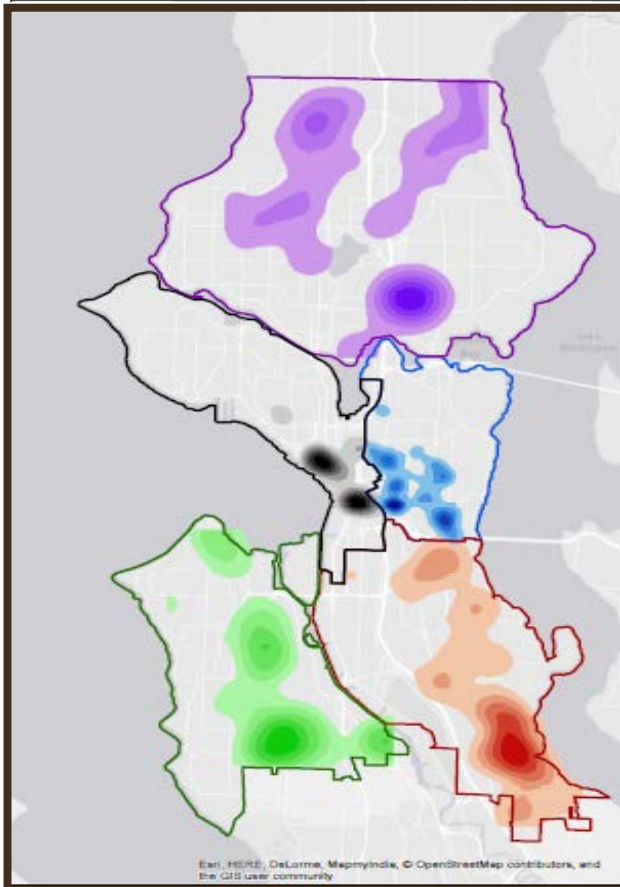

Shots Density by Precinct*



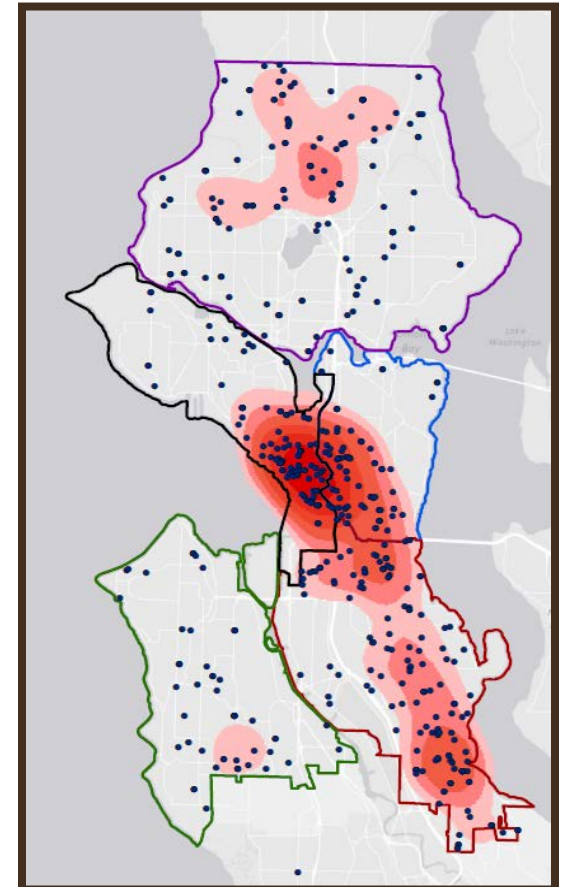

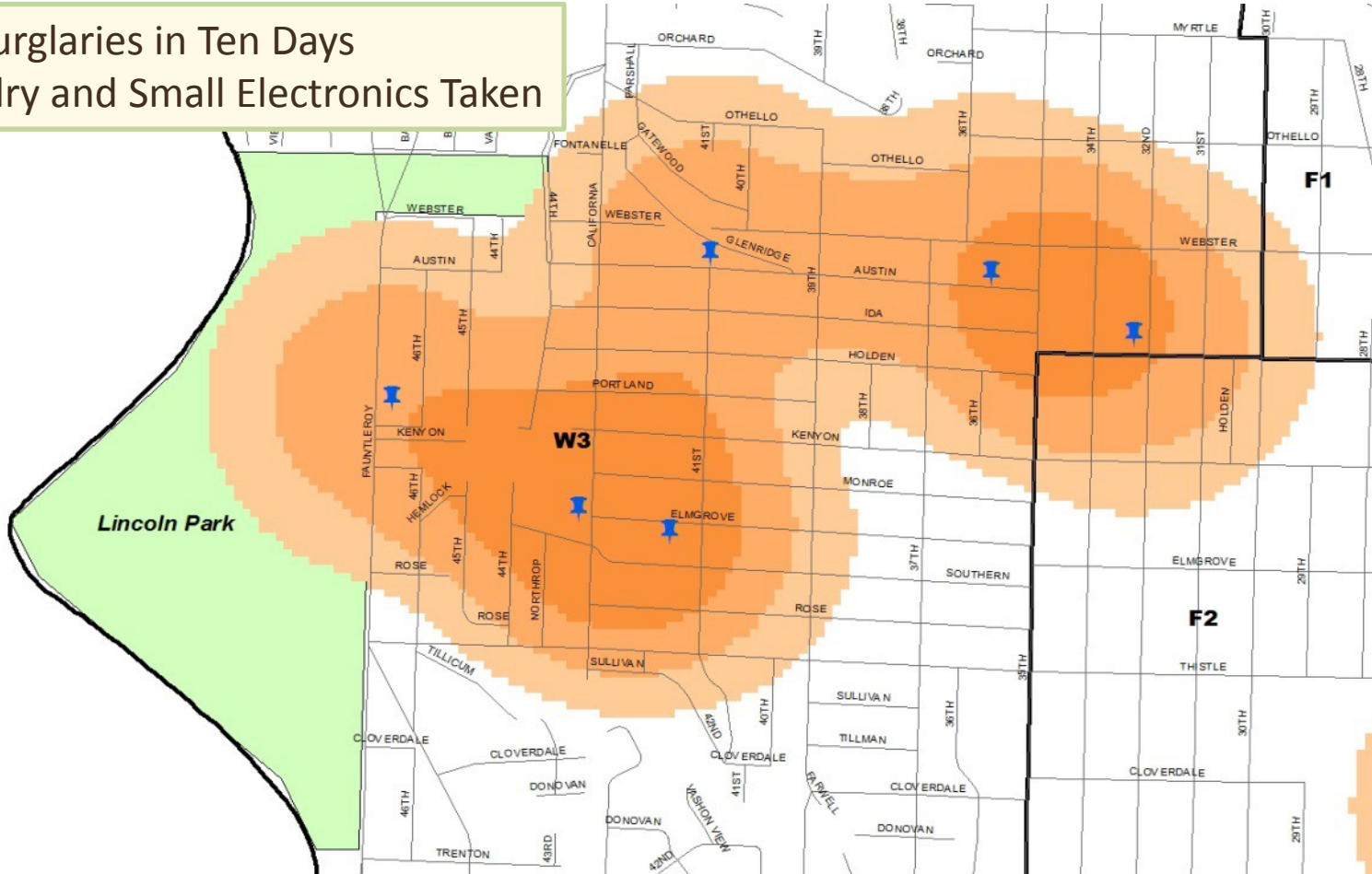

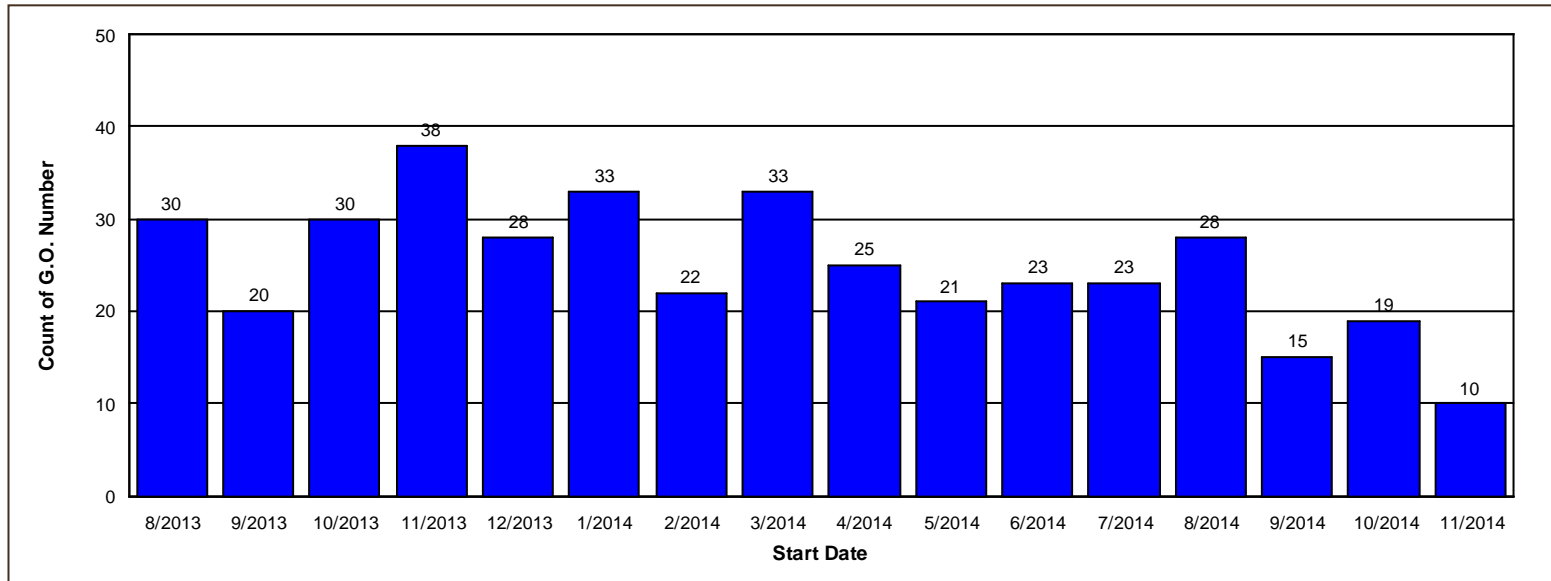

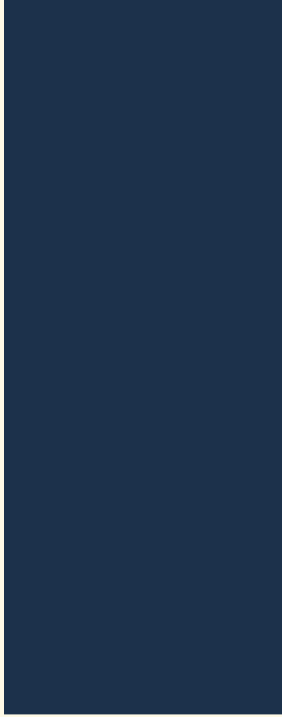

TRAINING COMPLIANCE

Instructor Led Compliance Rate

- One Day U of F– 97%

TRAINING COMPLIANCE

Training Messaging

- Special Orders are sent out with all training requirements for each training put on by the Education and Training Section
- At the end of each session a Non-Compliance report of those that have not attended the training is sent up the chain of command.
 - Individuals that are unavailable are removed from the list
- Via the Education and Training Section a “Not signed” up report is sent out by ASA Lalor to Captains and Lieutenants Weekly
