- WHEREAS, these guardians are dedicated members of the International Code Council (ICC), a nonprofit that brings together local, state, territorial, tribal, and federal officials who are experts in the built environment to create and implement the highest-quality codes to protect us in the buildings where we live, learn, work, and play; and
- WHEREAS, these modern building codes include safeguards to protect the public from hazards such as hurricanes, snowstorms, tornadoes, wildiand fires, floods; and
- WHEREAS, the City of Seattle is committed to developing a robust program to require the retrofitting of unreinforced masonry buildings across the city to protect our community and historic neighborhoods in the event of an earthquake, and
- WHEREAS, Building Safety Month is sponsored by the ICC to remind the public about the critical role of our communities' largely unknown protectors of public safety our local code officials who assure us of safe, sustainable, and affordable buildings that are essential to our prosperity; and
