NOTICE OF LAND USE CODE AMENDMENT AND DETERMINATION OF NON-SIGNIFICANCE

Pursuant to SMC 25.05.340 and WAC 197-11-340

Seattle Department of Construction and Inspections (SDCI) is proposing to amend the Land Use Code (Title 23) in subsection 23.49.156.A to clarify and improve the function of this provision. The proposed legislation clarifies that projects in the Living Building Pilot Program can use height bonuses to exceed 145 feet in height regardless of lot size under SMC 23.49.156.A in the Downtown Mixed Residential zone. The need for this amendment has been identified by citizens, elected officials and City staff.

ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION

After review of a completed environmental checklist and other information on file, the Seattle Department of Construction and Inspections (SDCI) has determined that the amendment described above will not have a probable significant adverse environmental impact and has issued a Determination of Non-Significance (DNS) under the State Environmental Policy Act (no Environmental Impact Statement required).
