

Scope of Work Update

- Working Groups Update
 - Policy/Advocacy Group
 - 2025 Task: Implement an Advocacy and Policy centered working group to discuss regional, state and federal trail policy, efforts, legislative concerns, advocacy opportunities, and funding opportunities.
 - Data/Metrics Working Group
 - 2025-2026 Task: Implement a Data Working Group that focuses on data collection, analysis; discussion of new data sources/meaningful ways to measure impact and benefit of trails.
 - Peer to Peer Networking Group
 - 2025-2026 Task: Implement a Peer to Peer Jurisdictional Networking Group that meets regularly to share best practices, case studies, and resources at a jurisdictional level among peers. This group will have access to a bi-monthly email, listserv, and to subject matter experts within the network.



Advocacy and Policy Working Group

Focus of group

- Discussion of Scope: Local, Regional, State, Federal
 - Actions: live in the state and region
 - Goal: be informed federally

Recent Topics of Conversation

- Effective strategies to involve decision makers and elected politicians in trail advocacy work
- Obtaining commitments from elected officials at advocacy events
- Feedback on statewide bike network panel discussion prompts
- Possibility of a legislative caucus focusing on trails
- King County Parks Levy support
- Equity in advocacy work

2026 Funding Partner Conversations

 Goals: Diversify the coalition's funding sources via a sustainable funding model to broaden our capacity, expand our resources, and strengthen our resiliency. Demonstrate to new partners and organizations that we have broad funding support from a variety of contributing partners.

New Partner Conversations

Goals: Bring new jurisdictional partners into the fold. Increase our collective impact. Expand our reach.

Data and Metrics Working Group

We are working with a key GIS volunteer to:

- Update our public facing map vision with current data
- Fine tune our map vision to be more user intuitive and easy to navigate/understand
- Track key metrics to ensure that we accurately measure our impact in regional trail development
- Understand the growth of the regional network since a analysis of trail data was last performed in 2022
- Next Steps
 - Working Groups will review SPRC trail data before sending to jurisdictional partners for review



Inclusion of Seattle Facilities in Regional Leafline Trails Network Map Vision

Historically it has been hard to create criteria for network inclusion that incorporates many of the on-street connections that are utilized in dense urban areas

We will be using Seattle's criteria for "all ages and abilities" facilities as a guide moving forward:

Bicycle facilities that serve all ages and abilities provide a comfortable separation from motor vehicles and focus on intersection safety.

- Off-street trails facilitates for two-way off-street bicycle use that may also be used by pedestrians, skaters, joggers, and other non-motorized users.
- Cycle tracks (Protected Bicycle Lanes) facilities physically separated from motor vehicle traffic and distinct from the sidewalk; they may be one-way or two-way, and may be at street level or raised several inches above.
- Neighborhood greenways residential streets with low motorized traffic volumes and speeds that are designated and designed to give bicycle and pedestrian safe and pleasant travel priority.






City of Seattle - Areas of Collaboration

- Provide insight into projects outside of the City that may tie into the City's existing and planned projects
- Cross jurisdictional collaboration peer to peer network
- Trail activations highlight recent development, big wins, and critical gaps that still exist
- Leafline can be a direct conduit to advocacy organizations working in your area




520 Trail Extension






Shoreline Rail Trail Extension






Green River Trail North Expansion (14th Ave S)






E Marginal Way (Continuing South to City line)
