ROWIM Update - Regulatory Update in December 2015 Subject:

Dear Ms. McLaughlin:

The purpose of the Freight Advisory Board (FAB) is to "advise the City Council, Mayor, and all departments and offices of the City in development of a functional and efficient freight system and on all matters related to freight and the impact that actions by the City may have upon the freight environment." (Resolution 31243)

We appreciate the work you are leading to update the Right of Way Improvement Manual and it will be a success as you incorporate the fourth modal plan, the Freight Master Plan, into the document. We understand that the update for the ROWIM is required by the end of 2015 to reflect the new regulations for surface water management and the FAB supports this partial update for the ROWIM for the City to remain in compliance with regulations.

The Freight Board, however, does not support any update to the ROWIM without fully reflecting an adopted Freight Master Plan and we strongly urge you to fully reflect the FMP as it is adopted by the City Council in 2016. A draft Freight Master Plan is scheduled for February 2016.
