BACKGROUND

Earlier this year the Seattle Department of Transportation (SDOT) completed construction on the first phase of a project on 23rd Ave to improve safety and mobility for people who drive, walk, bike, and take transit in the area. Construction for Phase 2 of the project is expected to begin as soon as early 2018.

The 23rd Ave corridor connects up to 20,000 people each day to their homes, jobs, schools, and more. Major improvements are needed because the street is in poor condition, including:

- Many collisions
- Potholes and cracks in the pavement
- Narrow lanes
- Narrow and uneven sidewalks
- Not enough space between people driving on 23rd Ave/23rd Ave S and people using the sidewalk
- Back-ups created by left-turning vehicles

PROJECT ELEMENTS

Planned project elements in Phase 2 include:

- Sidewalk improvements
- Repaving the street
- Redesigning the street from four lanes to three (one lane in each direction and a center turn lane) from S Jackson St to S Holgate St
- Replacing the water main under the street from S Jackson St to S Norman St
- Installing new storm drains
- Replacing water service pipes and fire hydrants from S Norman St to Rainier Ave S
- Transit improvements, such as real-time arrival information and bus pullouts (space for buses to stop outside of the flow of traffic)
- Adjacent Central Area Neighborhood Greenway route

Changing the street design to three lanes is expected to increase safety by reducing collisions, reducing speeding, allowing vehicles to turn without blocking traffic, managing drivers cutting in and out of lanes, creating space for wider sidewalks, making streets easier to cross, and making it easier for freight and transit to travel.
