


Draft Home Zone Map (Version 3)

Rainier View Draft Home Zone (3) - Do Not Share Outside of Steering Committee




Draft Home Zone Map - SPU Drainage Concerns

Draft Home Zone Map - Proposed Walkways




Walkway Concept Type 1

- Referred to as "Walkway" on the Draft Home Zone Map
- Adds asphalt walkway in section of right of way (ROW) that is currently unpaved
- May include conveyance swale

Walkway Concept Type 1




Walkway Concept Type 1 - Extra Swale



Walkway Concept Type 2

- Referred to as "Dedicated Pedestrian Space" on the Draft Home Zone Map
- Uses only existing asphalt
- Uses paint and wheel stops to separate a pedestrian path on the existing street

Next Steps

1. Develop Concepts for Broader Community

- Conceptual designs need to be developed for each project on the draft map
- For projects funded by the Home Zone budget, as well as walkways receiving additional funding, SDOT staff will focus development on projects prioritized by the Steering Committee

2. Broad Community Outreach

- The community will be presented with the draft home zone map and descriptions of the projects
- The community will help choose which projects on the map are funded

Other Funding (Not from Home Zone)

- Pedestrian Master Plan (PMP) Budget
 - Traffic Calming on S Bangor St
 - Traffic Calming on Beacon Ave S
 - Intersection Improvement at S Leo St/Beacon Ave S/51st Ave S
- Safe Routes to School (SRTS)
 - Walkway projects near and connecting to Rainier View Elementary School
 - Some locations have funds already allocated to them specifically
 - Additional funds will fund locations based on community input
- Your Voice, Your Choice (YVYC)
 - One walkway location, already funded and designed
- City Council Allocation
 - Walkway projects in Rainier View, locations to be determined based on community input



Home Zone Funding - \$200,000 Total

- Already in Work (Based on earlier community input)
 - Traffic Calming on Hazel - \$10,000
- Remaining funds to be allocated based on outreach process
 - Home Zone funded projects may include:
 - Intersection Improvements (except for Leo/Beacon/51st)
 - School Crossing Improvements
 - Open Space Improvements
 - School/Community Building
 - Curb Ramps
 - Vegetation Trimming
 - Converting S Fountain St. to One-Way (for segment between S Leo and 56th Ave)
