



2nd Ave and Denny Way Raised Protected Bike Lane

PROJECT OVERVIEW

This project will re-establish a protected bike lane (PBL) on 2nd Ave for about one block, just south of Denny Way. The previously existing PBL was removed by the Climate Pledge Arena developer (Oak View Group) in the fall of 2021. The 2nd Ave & Denny Way PBL Project will adjust the curb line to install a raised PBL at this location.

This project is part of the North Downtown Mobility Action Program (NODO MAP) in coordination with the redevelopment of the new Climate Pledge Arena and other adjacent projects.

WHAT'S BEEN COMPLETED

- New curb ramps
- Accessible pedestrian push buttons
- Refreshed pavement markings north of Denny
- New signage allowing for people driving south on 2nd Ave to turn left onto eastbound Denny Way

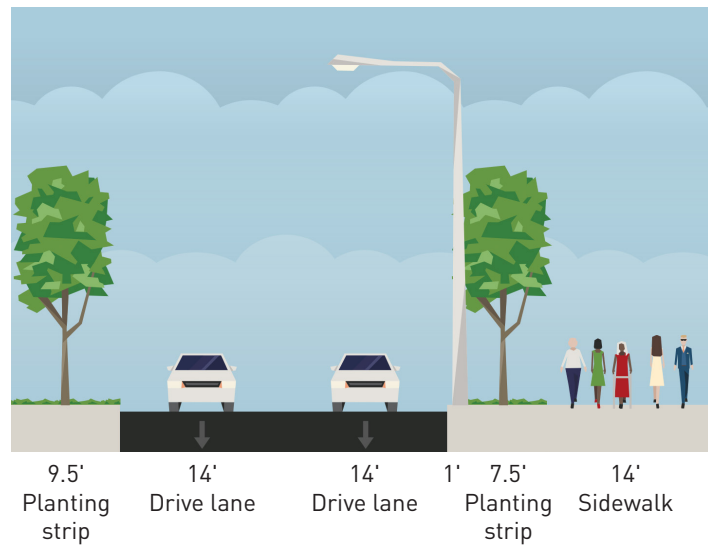
WHAT'S UPCOMING

- Extended curb to create a 130-foot raised two-way protected bike lane on the east side of 2nd Ave, south of Denny Way
- Drainage improvements (in collaboration with Seattle Public Utilities)

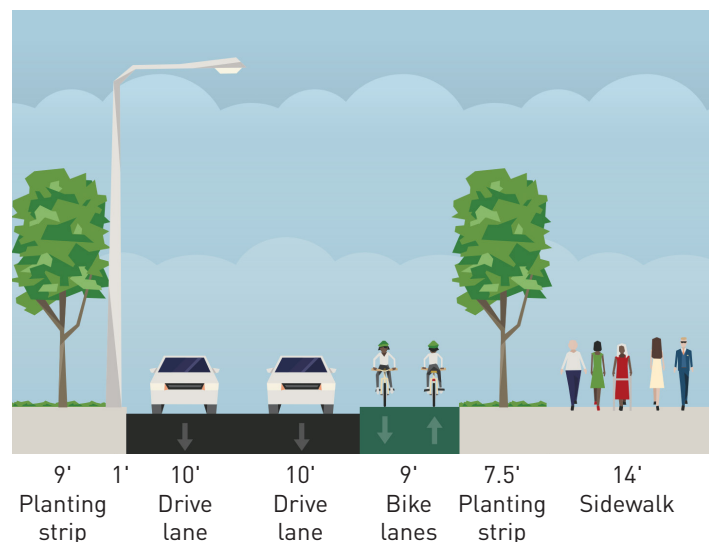
TIMELINE
