





Information about your water, drainage, wastewater and solid waste utility services.

Protect Your Home from Frozen Pipes

Temperatures below freezing can cause water pipes in your home to leak or burst. This can lead to water outages, flooding, and property damage.



To protect your home from pipe breaks, disconnect garden hoses, insulate outdoor pipes and spigots, and insulate indoor pipes in your crawl space, basement, or attic.

When the temperature drops below freezing, protect indoor sink pipes that are against exterior walls by opening under-sink cabinet doors to allow indoor heat to circulate.

Caulk around pipes where they enter the house and close all foundation vents to minimize cold wind from blowing into your house.

Pipes exposed to drafts from open foundation vents are most at risk



of freezing or splitting during cold weather. Close off these vents by sliding cut pieces of wood or Styrofoam into the vent openings (open the vents again in the spring to prevent dry rot).

Locate your main water shutoff:

Know where your water shutoffs are located. Shut-off valves can be indoors or outdoors, usually in a basement, crawlspace, or garage.

If pipes break of freeze:

If a water pipe breaks, immediately close the main shut-off valve to stop flooding. If you cannot turn off the main shut-off valve, SPU customers can call (206) 386-1800 for assistance.

Project Spotlight: South Park Drainage and Roadway Partnership



Seattle Public Utilities (SPU) and the Seattle Department of Transportation (SDOT) are working together on the South Park Drainage and Roadway Partnership project to construct streets and a drainage system that will improve chronic flooding and drainage issues. The new drainage system will use storm drains and pipes to capture stormwater (rainfall runoff) and direct it to the future pump station during hightide. The pump station is currently in construction.

The general project area is South Park Industrial Area between 2nd Ave S and 8th Ave S, and S Holden St and S Monroe St. Construction has begun and is expected to be completed by the end of 2022.
