

May- Interview candidates & leadership recommendations










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Focus Area Progress – Investments




- 2 of our investments are considered at risk.
 - Ship Canal Water Quality Project
 - DWW Asset MGMT. and Opportunity Work.
- On track and minor delay initiatives have either remained this way through out the year or have bounced back and forth in these statues.
 Overall, an investment that moves into the minor delay can typically come back the following quarter.
- Highlighted investments are:
 - Green Stormwater Infrastructure
 - Support for the Unsheltered
 - RV Pump out program

- Overall SPU is accomplishing commitments made for each initiative.
- A few delays are experienced in the following:

 - Risk and Resilience






NP PDEB – Report Refresher
