In Seattle, recyclables and food waste are not allowed in the garbage. Please put those materials in the correct place:



**Recycle**

**MUST be EMPTY, CLEAN & DRY**

**1** Paper

**2** Cardboard — flattened

**3** Plastic bottles & containers

**4** Metal cans

**5** Glass bottles & jars

**No Plastic Bags**
