Bicycle Master Plan University District

- Built 2014
 - 12th Ave NE Greenway
- 2015 Implementation
 - Roosevelt Way NE / U Bridge
 - NE Campus Pkwy
 - NE Ravenna Blvd / 15th Ave NE
- 2017 Implementation
 - NE 40th St



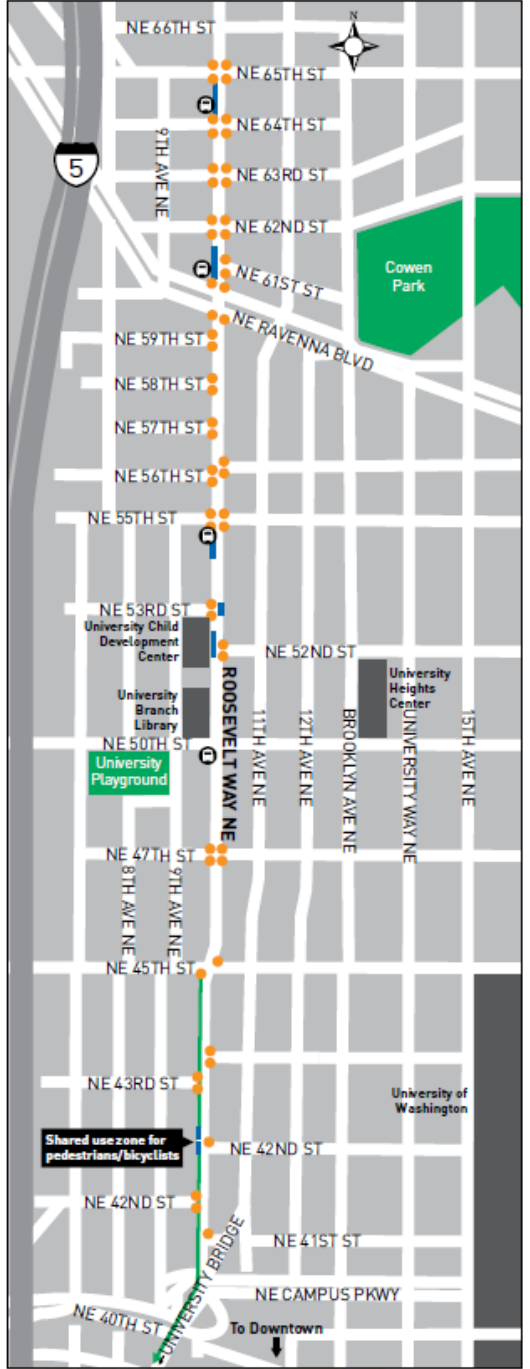
Paving Project

- NE 65th Street to the University Bridge
 - Repave
 - 47 new curb bulbs
 - 134 new or upgraded curb ramps
 - Consolidate 9 bus stops to 6
- NE 47th Street across the University Bridge
 - Install a protected bike lane

LEGEND

- Curb bulb
- | Sidewalk extension*
- Ⓜ New in-lane bus stop
- | New protected bike lane (will remove parking on west side of street)

*Sidewalk extensions will not remove any legal parking.

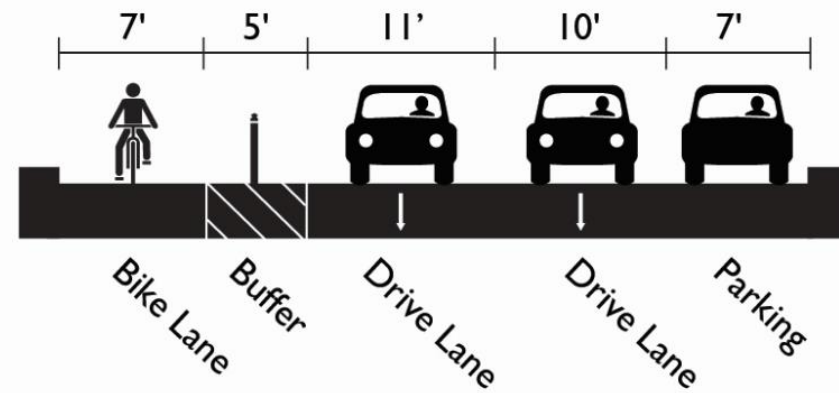


Protected bike lane

Protected bike lane from NE 45th Street across the University Bridge



A bike rider uses the two-way protected bike lane on Linden Avenue N

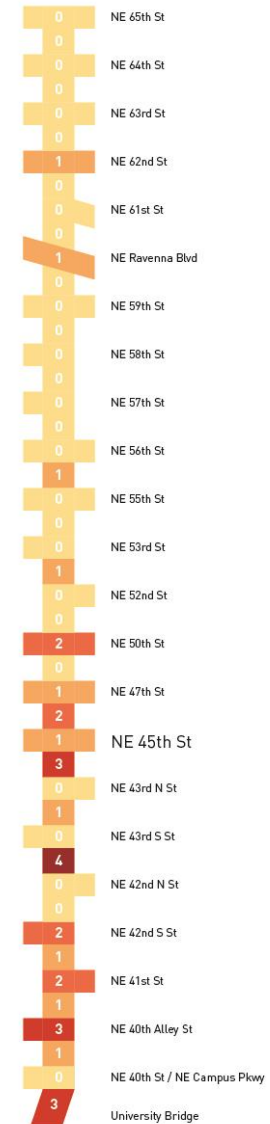


Replaces existing on-street parking and bicycle lane

Why NE 45th St to the Bridge?

Three Reasons

1. Of the 31 bicycle collisions on this corridor in the past four years, 21 (or 68%) have been south of NE 45th St.
2. Bike volumes are the highest south of NE 45th St.
3. This section of Roosevelt Way NE has the steepest grade – 4.3%.

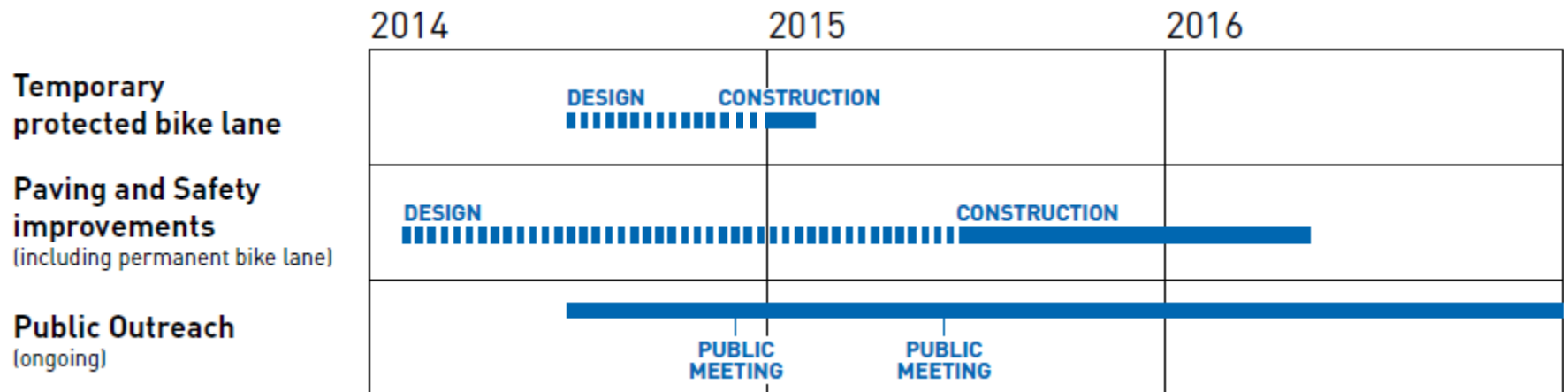
