



ROUTE 48 ELECTRIFICATION (METRO)

- LOWERS GHG AND IMPROVES AIR QUALITY
- LEVERAGES EXISTING TROLLEY INFRASTRUCTURE
- CONSTRUCTION AS EARLY AS 2023



PROJECT OVERVIEW

• UW TRANSFERRED SITES TO CITY OF SEATTLE

In June 2020, the University of Washington transferred three sites to the City of Seattle, including the former UW Laundry site

HEAVILY PROGRAMMED SITE

Terms of transfer state redevelopment is for affordable housing, including supportive housing, and an early childcare and early learning research facility

POTENTIAL OPPORTUNITY FOR OPEN SPACE

Fulfill park gap and longstanding neighborhood goal

ADJACENT SOUND TRANSIT SITE

Sound Transit plans to redevelop East Portal site as affordable housing



SITE PLANNING AND URBAN DESIGN STRATEGY STUDY

DELIVERABLES

- Preferred site plan
- Street network proposal
- Open space plan
- Green stormwater infrastructure recommendations
- Urban design recommendations

Inform future redevelopment request for proposals and long-term station area vision
